The 2013 Environmental Quality Award winners were:

<u>Facebook</u> for their efforts to reduce water consumption, energy use, and waste, and their outstanding efforts in using or promoting alternative commute options to their employees through shuttles, vanpools, and bicycling that over 40% of their employees use to get to work.

<u>Menlo Business Park</u> for their efforts in completing a substantial energy efficiency retrofit that will reduce over one million pounds of greenhouse gas emissions associated with electricity consumption every year, and save over \$300,000 in annual operating costs. This is the equivalent of removing about 200 cars from the road annually.

<u>Carolyn Dorsch</u> for her remarkable dedication in educating the community about the benefits of backyard composting.

<u>Pacific Biosciences</u> for their waste minimization initiatives that have diverted 66% of waste from being landfilled through implementation of recycling and compost programs.

<u>Hillview Middle School</u> for reducing its energy and carbon footprint by designing and building a new energy efficient school and installing solar panels that produce clean energy that will save the school \$85,000 in annual operating costs.
