Welcome to the Kentucky Health Information Exchange Newsletter!



Special Points of Interest

As of March 17, 2014:

⇒KHIE has 556 signed participation agreements (representing 1,691 locations)

⇒A total of 762 [provider locations](#) are submitting [live data](#) and exchanging information (see Page 5 for more details)

⇒80% of hospitals in KY are live on KHIE

⇒Over \$161,000,000 has been paid to Medicaid hospitals and providers in KY, through the KY Medicaid EHR Incentive Program

⇒KHIE is averaging over 100,000 queries per week

Governor Steve Beshear issued an Executive Order in August 2009, establishing the Governor's Office of Electronic Health Information in the Cabinet for Health and Family Services to oversee the advancement of health information exchange in Kentucky.

KHIE continues to build its robust health information exchange and allows providers to access the right information at the right time in order to make the right decisions. KHIE also facilitates providers in meeting several objectives of Stages 1 and 2 of the Meaningful Use EHR Incentive Program. Overall, the KHIE works to fulfill the three-part aim: better care, lower costs, improved public health.

KHIE has created two new public health reporting and attestation guidance documents for [Stage 1](#) and [Stage 2](#) of the Meaningful Use EHR Incentive Program. The documents serve to help guide eligible providers and hospitals across the commonwealth to meet the public health reporting requirements for Meaningful Use. KENTUCKY MEDICAID EHR INCENTIVE PROGRAM

POINTERS OF THE MONTH

REMINDERS:

- EPs attesting for Program Year 2013 must submit their attestation prior to 12:00 midnight, March 31, 2014.
- EPs can begin attesting as a Meaningful User for Program Year 2014 on April 1, 2014.
- KCHIP reports requests are automated and are to be completed through the EHR attestation website. Instructions are located on the EHR website under Publications.

90 DAY PATIENT VOLUME:

- Confirm how your practice bills! If every provider in the practice submits claims with their individual NPI in the rendering **and** billing fields, it would not behoove the provider to calculate patient volume at the group level. Patient volume would never be verified in this case as the patient encounter data is “housed” under the individual NPI not the group NPI.
- When calculating patient volume at the group level, the encounter data must be from all providers in the practice not the individual provider attesting.

MEANINGFUL USE:

- In order for all providers to meet Meaningful Use in any Stage, a signed Participation Agreement along with the appropriate signed addendum must be completed with KHIE.
- Providers are now required to upload their KHIE Meaningful Use Confirmation and KHIE Go-Live Approval forms when attesting to MU.


