West End, Shelby, Airport Postal Sites Studied For Closure- From Courier Journal MLK Jr. Branch Serving West Louisville on the List

Three Louisville retail post office outlets are among nearly 3,700 across the country that are being studied for possible shut down, as the U. S. Postal Service continues to struggle with declining business and <u>financial</u> losses. Although the bulk of the branches being studied for possible closure are in rural areas, three of the sites are in Louisville: **the Martin Luther King Jr. branch at 2727 W. Broadway in the Russell neighborhood**, the Shelby Station at 2312 S. Preston St. and a bulk-mail and air-mail service center at 4440 Crittenden Drive near Louisville International <u>Airport</u>.



Postal officials said that users have 60 days to file comments at each site about the possible closure of each or call Consumer Affairs (502) 423-4220. If a decision is made to close a location, users will be able to appeal to the independent Postal Regulatory Commission. Or, postal officials also could call a public meeting to gather comment. Public has until September 27th to file comments.
