#### Group and Transitional Housing Update

The resolution calling for a Moratorium on Group and Transitional Housing by Councilwoman Hamilton was introduced on May 8th and has been referred to the Council's Planning and Zoning committee for further discussion and action. The next meeting of the Planning and Zoning committee is Tuesday, May 27th at 1:30 p.m. and it may be heard in committee at that time. If your schedule permits, please plan to attend the committee meeting to show your support on the 3rd floor of City Hall in the Council Chambers.

On May 13th, Councilwoman Hamilton met with Codes and Regulations Director Jim Mims, Donovan Taylor of the Chickasaw Federation, Bonnie Cole, representing the Shawnee Neighborhood Association and Lisa Dettlinger of the Center for Neighborhoods to discuss holding a mini "Planning College" for residents of District 5 and other neighborhoods that are interested in this issue. The two-day evening sessions will empower residents to understand current regulations and learn how to stay on top of and influence land use, planning and zoning issues and decisions in their neighborhoods. You will also learn how to research property ownership on problem properties. We are tentatively looking at holding these sessions from 6 to 8:30 p.m. on Tuesdays, June 17 and June 24th at the Louisville Urban League. Although the sessions will be free and open to the public, we will encourage pre-registration so that we will have enough materials and certificates can be prepared for those that complete the planning college.



## TARC Adjusting Service on Two Routes Adding Service to Kentucky Kingdom on Route #2-Second Street

TARC is making minor service adjustments to two routes and adding new service to Kentucky Kingdom effective Sunday, June 8.

#### **Route #2-Second Street**

The changes have been put into place to give a service option for employees and patrons of Kentucky Kingdom, which opens later this month. TARC riders should catch their bus at stops near Gate 2 and Gate 3 at the Kentucky Fairgrounds.

On Monday, June 9, a trip leaving Louisville International Airport will start at 8:54 a.m., which is 10 minutes later than the previous trip. That southbound trip from downtown will also leave 10 minutes later, at 9:25 a.m., from 5th Market Street. Additionally, a new weekday trip leaving the airport at 7:12 p.m. will be added.

On Saturdays, new trips leaving 5th and Market at 10:15 a.m. and the airport at 9:12 p.m. will be added. On Sundays and holidays, new trips will be leaving 5th and Market at 10:15 a.m. and the airport at 7:12 p.m.

#### Route #43-Poplar Level Road

Time adjustments of a few minutes at stops south of Poplar Level Road and Eastern Parkway and Poplar Level Road at Indian Trail will be enacted. Arrival and departure times at stops south of Eastern Parkway will be adjusted by 2-3 minutes on all trips. Stop times at Poplar Level Road and Eastern Parkway and north of that intersection will remain the same.
