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City Seeking Creative West Main Street Ideas

Officials hope to improve safety

Louisville Mayor Greg Fischer is soliciting proposals designed to encourage business growth and other activity in the Russell, Shippingport and Portland neighborhoods in order to improve the appearance and safety for pedestrians, cyclists and motorists.

Mayor Fischer is seeking proposals from design firms and others interested in a bidding for a \$150,000 streetscape improvement project in the 900 block of West Main Street intended to improve connectivity and development opportunities in the city.

This project is part of a broader strategy to revitalize west Louisville as the Business Improvement District of the Louisville Downtown Partnership recently expanded westward by seven blocks. In addition, a \$35 million downriver expansion of Waterfront Park and a \$25 million West Louisville FoodPort have been planned, led by District 5 Councilwoman Cheri Bryant Hamilton.



The Leadership Louisville Center is now accepting project proposals from nonprofit organizations for both the **Yum! IGNITES Louisville Challenge** and **Encore Louisville**. Both of these offer tremendous value to the nonprofits that they help, and we have more capacity than ever to help local agencies.

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Mental Health First Aid Training One Day Training Offered

Mental Health First Aid is a one-day training course for people ages 16 and over that is similar to regular first aid but deals with mental health problems. Many people with mental disorders delay seeking help, but they are more likely to receive professional help when this is suggested by someone in their social network. Members of the public are far more likely to have contact with someone in a mental health crisis, such as being suicidal, and want to know how respond. Mental Health First Aid teaches about early intervention and support to foster recovery and resiliency and is based on the belief that individuals experiencing these challenges can and do get better, and can use their strengths to stay well.

During the eight-hour course you'll learn the signs and symptom of different types of mental illnesses, how they can affect a person's daily life and what you can do to help when someone you know is experiencing these challenges. You'll learn about :

1. Risk factors and warning signs of mental health problems.
2. Information on depression, anxiety, trauma, psychosis and addiction disorders.
3. A 5-step action plan to help when someone is developing a mental health problem or is in crisis.
4. Increasing awareness, decreasing stigma, and increasing confidence in providing help.

What's with Those Brown Carts at Downtown Restaurants?

In March last year restaurants and coffee shops in Louisville's Central Business District began collecting their wet material, such as food scraps, liquids, and used paper products, in brown carts serviced by QRS Recycling. The brown carts have become a common sight in downtown Louisville, marking restaurants that are participating in our Wet/Dry Recycling Program. This material is ultimately composted and reused, rather than taking up valuable space in the landfill.



The Green Fork Award, established by Mayor Greg Fischer in January 2015, was created to recognize restaurants that consistently comply with the new program. Each quarter a list of restaurants that have been in compliance through the year will be published. At the end of the year, restaurants that have complied for the entire year will receive the Green Fork Award and be given certifying stickers to display in their windows as a way to let customers know they are environmentally responsible businesses

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TARC Service Changes Effective Aug. 16



TARC will make service changes effective Sunday, Aug. 16. The changes were proposed in April followed by a public comment period including public meetings.

The changes will result in less frequent bus service on sections of **Fourth Street (Rt. #4), Broadway and Bardstown Road (Rt. #23), and Dixie and Preston highways (Rt. #18).**

Passengers on those routes are advised to check schedules online at www.ridetarc.org or use the Google online trip planner because bus arrival times at stops will change. Even with the reductions, buses will still arrive at stops every 13-15 minutes on the busiest stretches of the routes from 6 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. on weekdays. On Dixie Highway south of Heaton Road, bus frequency on weekdays will be reduced from every 15 to every 30 minutes. Service reductions were proposed to address a budget shortfall in the fiscal year that began July 1.

Metro Animal Services staff will be tracking animal licenses by zip code in order to determine which districts are in compliance with the city ordinances and where resources can be provided. Animals without tags or other forms of owner identification may end up in Metro Animal Services, and it is necessary that the citizens of Louisville be **responsible pet owners**.

- **All cats (altered or intact) MUST be licensed. Indoor or outdoor!**

Alcohol Beverage Control Notification



Advertisement for a Quota Retail Package, NQ Retail Malt Beverage Package & 2 a.m. Hours License(s) Mintana, LLC. DBA/ Parkway Liquor—2038 Northwestern Parkway

KRS 243.360 requires a person to first advertise their intention to apply for alcoholic beverage licenses in the newspaper.

Any person, association, corporation, or body politic may protest the granting of the license(s) by writing the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control, 1003 Twilight Trail, Frankfort, Ky. 40601-8400, within 30 days of the date of this legal publication.

Some of the reasons for refusal of a license as stated in KRS 243.450 are

- **Premise does not comply fully with all alcoholic beverage control statutes and regulations of the board.**
- **The applicant or the premises does not comply with all regulations of a city administrator.**
- **The applicant has done an act for which a revocation of license would be authorized.**
- **The applicant has made any false material statement in his application.**
- **Other factors include public sentiment in the area, number of licensed outlets in the area, potential for future growth, type of area involved, type of transportation available and financial potential of the area.**
