**An Urban Wilderness Canoe Adventure is coming to Louisville!** Join Metro parks and our partners and canoe the Ohio River, taking off from both **Riverview** and **Shawnee Parks**. We will showcase the beauty of the great outdoors...in our own backyard. **There are no JCPS classes on Friday, October 2nd so please join us at Shawnee Park!** The Canoemobile is a roving fleet of six, 24-foot Voyageur canoes that travels across America to bring environmental literacy to urban youth. Started in 2010, the Canoemobile is the national extension of the highly successful Urban Wilderness Canoe Adventures (UWCA). From San Francisco to the Bronx, communities across the United States have welcomed Canoemobile on their local rivers and lakes, serving thousands of youth and adults of all backgrounds and abilities along the way.

**Free trips** will be conducted in safe and stable 24-foot Voyageurs, which hold 9 participants. **Safety equipment and trained staff will be provided.** Event is open to everyone 3 years of age and older.
