Home Burglary Prevention Tips:

- Leaving home? Make sure the doors, windows and garage doors are closed and locked. Turn Lights on if gone for an extended time.
- Check and/or install outdoor lighting.
- Trim trees and bushes away from windows.
- Check the locks on windows and doors. Replace if possible. Deadbolt locks are preferred for doors.
- Get to know your neighbors! Neighbors that watch out for each other produce neighborhoods criminals tend to leave alone.
- Keep photographs and put personalized identification numbers unique to you on valuable property. **Record all serial numbers** for firearms, power tools, bicycles and electronics.
- Do not leave boxes or packaging outside the night before pickup, instead break the boxes down and place outside the morning of.
- Going on vacation? Have someone check on your home: neighbors, friends or police. Stop your mail service and place lights on timers.
