ISSUE TO BE DISCUSSED

Proposed amendments to Chapter 223, Zoning, regarding communication towers.

BACKGROUND

Staff will provide the Board with an overview of the types of communications towers and the County's current regulations regarding the placement of communication towers. In addition, the Board will be asked to consider amending § 223-15 of the Code which governs the distance requirements for cellular towers from certain other uses and property.

Specifically, the following changes are proposed:

- 1. Reduce the minimum distance requirements between proposed towers and Residential Districts, the Historic District, the Mobile Home Park District, and existing dwellings, schools, houses of worship or institutions of human care from an amount equaling the height of the proposed tower <u>plus 200</u> feet to a distance equaling the height of the proposed tower plus an additional distance equaling <u>25%</u> of the proposed tower height in the Agricultural, Industrial, Conservation, and Business Districts.
- 2. Reduce the minimum distance requirement from all overhead transmission lines from a distance equaling twice the height of the tower to a distance equaling 1.25 times the height of the tower in the Agricultural, Industrial, Conservation, and Business Districts.

Furthermore, an amendment to the Zoning Ordinance is proposed to clarify that the setback provisions for communications towers would be inapplicable to dwellings located on the property where the proposed tower is to be located.

REQUESTED ACTION

Consideration of proposed amendments and approval to proceed to a public hearing.

Department of Permits and Inspection Briefing Paper

Issue:

Streamlining the current permit fee schedule while remaining revenue neutral.

Background:

The current fee schedule is cumbersome for designers, contractors and citizens. When a permit is processed several calculations are performed and questions asked in order to calculate the fee. If the applicant or a caller that is inquiring about a fee does not have all of the information, an estimate cannot be given or if the applicant/caller provides inaccurate information, the wrong fee can be calculated. This new process would be user friendly for designers, contractors and citizens and allow staff to interact more efficiently when providing estimates and fee's for permits. This proposal would simplify the process and reduce the number of steps for commercial projects from 5 down to 2 and residential projects from 3 down to 2.

This new fee schedule as proposed would be revenue neutral.

Exercise Option to Purchase Evelyn Mae Barnes Estate Property for Winfield Community Park

Background:

Carroll County continues to experience a need for park land and athletic fields in many areas. The Winfield Recreation Council was exploring the ability to develop a practice field at a County owned parcel on Streaker Road. Concerns were raised regarding limitations of that site that led to a recommendation to sell that parcel and to look for a more appropriate location for the park.

This 9.16 acre Barnes property is located directly opposite Winfield Elementary School and is an excellent park site due to its central location and open cleared fields. The option to purchase was made by the owners and the County on October 20, 2011. The notice of intent to purchase was advertised on November 8, 2011 and the 15 day waiting period has expired.

Program Open Space funds in the amount of \$155,272 that may only be used for acquisition are available towards the purchase price of \$200,000. The remaining balance of \$44,728 would need to be transferred from Land Bank funds, impact fees or general Program Open Space funds (up to a maximum of \$190,000) to complete the acquisition. A resolution will follow once settlement is reached.

Presentation of Fiscal Year 2011 Concurrency Management Report and Recommended Changes to Chapter 71

Background:

The Department of Land Use, Planning & Development will present the Concurrency Management Report to the Board of County Commissioners for their use and reference. During the October 18, 2011 Planning Commission meeting, the Commission approved the Fiscal Year 2011 Concurrency Management Report and voted to forward the report to the Board.

The Concurrency Management Report is prepared annually for the Board of County Commissioners and the Planning Commission to assist in the Community Investment Program planning process, to recommend possible building permit caps for areas of the County where facilities or services are not adequate to serve proposed residential development, and to identify issues regarding implementation of Concurrency Management.

The Fiscal Year 2011 Concurrency Management Report recommends changes to Chapter 71, *Adequate Public Facilities and Concurrency Management*. The proposed changes add detached and attached accessory dwellings to the list of uses that Chapter 71 does not apply to. The proposed changes also include using a rolling 24-month period for review of fire and EMS late and no responses, rather than quarters.

The Fiscal Year 2011 Concurrency Management Report recommends no new building permit caps. There is currently a zero building permit cap in the Mount Airy Middle School enrollment area. Mount Airy Middle School is the only school in the County that is considered inadequate under Concurrency Management.

Issue: Bulk Water Station – Freedom Water Treatment Plant

Background: On August 4, 2011, the Bureau of Utilities received approval from the Board of County Commissioners to proceed with coordinating with other county agencies for the creation of a bulk water station at the Freedom Water Treatment Plant.

The current bulk water system, located at the Martz Road Tank, allows only six key-holding customers to purchase bulk water. The establishment of a bulk water station at the Freedom Water Treatment Plant will provide convenient access to bulk water to all who desire it. Having bulk water available to all lessens the incentive to steal water from fire hydrants.

The Bureau of Utilities has coordinated with other county agencies to develop a plan to implement a bulk water station at the Freedom Water Treatment Plant. Elements of the plan include:

- Charging \$.02 per gallon
- Operating hours Monday through Saturday 6 a.m. until 9 p.m. and Sunday from 1 p.m. until 9 p.m., and by appointment only on County holidays
- Creating accounts and billing larger commercial customers
- Accepting cash and checks at the time of purchase from smaller customers
- Have the station operational by March 1, 2012

In order to implement the recommended bulk water station and rate, the fee structure needs to be changed in Section 179-7 item D of the Code of Local Public Laws, through the legislative process. A public hearing is required before this change can be made.

The recommended revision to the code is as follows:

Water haulers shall draw public water from one or more locations determined by the County, the use shall be metered, and the hauler shall pay a fee which shall be set and may be amended from time to time by resolution of the Board of County Commissioners.

Desired Action: Approval to proceed to public hearing on changes to Section 179-7 item D of the Code of Local Public Laws, in order to implement the bulk water system and rate structure at the Freedom Water Treatment Plant.
