Background: The Maryland Department of Housing and Community Development (DHCD) has awarded \$40,000 to operate the Rental Allowance Program (RAP) in FY16. Citizen Services and Human Services Programs of Carroll County have jointly operated the program for 21 years. HSP maintains the waiting list, determines eligibility and provides case management to participants. Citizen Services performs housing inspections, reviews and approves rental agreements, secures the RAP housing contract and pays the rent stipend to the landlord. RAP does not require matching funds. RAP funds are an essential component of the continuum of services used to assist the homeless to regain and retain housing.

Program: The Rental Allowance Program (RAP) provides a rent stipend and case management for up to one year. In FY 15, HSP served sixteen (16) households with children (57 people) that were very low-income families leaving shelter. HSP was able to serve this number of families with FY 15 funds and unencumbered FY 14 funds.

Purpose:

Public Hearing and Possible Decision on Amendment to the Ten Year Solid Waste Management Plan in accordance with Environment Article, §9-1712, Annotated Code of Maryland.

Background:

In 2014, the Maryland General Assembly passed Senate Bill 781, Environment – Recycling – Special Events. The law requires organizers of special events meeting certain criteria to provide a recycling receptacle adjacent to each trash receptacle, ensure recycling receptacles are clearly distinguished from trash receptacles, and ensure that recyclable materials are collected for recycling. Special event organizers must conduct recycling in accordance with the County's Comprehensive Solid Waste Management Plan (CSWM). The law also required each county to update its plan by October, 2015, to address the collection and recycling recyclable materials from special events.

Office of Zoning Administration has added waste and recycling requirements for permitting of special events.

Amendment was certified to be consistent with the Carroll County Master Plan on June 16, 2015.

Issue: Briefing & Discussion – Landfill Projects

Hodges Landfill Cap

cc:

The landfill operated from 1965 to 1981 for disposal of various household and municipal wastes. It was capped with a soil & geomembrane liner cover system in 1991. Since 1992, the western slope exhibited signs of cover soil slippage. Recent evidence confirms soil slippage continues resulting in open soil cracks exposing cap liner, deformation at the toe of the slope, and damage to groundwater monitoring wells. There is potential for further downslope movement of soil under heavy rain events that might ultimately cause damage to the liner.

The most secure means to prevent that damage is replacement of the existing smooth liner with a dual-sided, textured geomembrane liner and drainage layer. This project is budgeted. Design and engineering will prepare an RFP for the project to commence in the spring of 2016.

Northern Landfill Capping Cells 1 & 2

The outside slopes of Cells 1 and 2 have been budgeted for final capping. This will eliminate this area as a source of rainwater infiltration into the old waste that becomes leachate. Capping provides several benefits:

- Less leachate provides cost savings in leachate disposal and hauling.
- Capped slopes eliminate threat of leachate seeps from entering the environment.
- Cap liner provides a seal to minimize migration of landfill gas to the environment.
- Costs to perform the capping no longer need to be accrued toward final closure of the landfill.

This project is budgeted. Design and engineering will prepare an RFP for the project to commence in the spring of 2016.

Northern Landfill Cell 3 Stormwater Control

The inactive area of Cell 3 has a synthetic cover that sheds stormwater. Wind and UV light exposure has caused damage, resulting in some stormwater entering the leachate collection system. Because this area of Cell 3 may not be needed for 10 or more years, a longer term stormwater diversion system is proposed.

Carroll County Health Department Briefing Paper September 24, 2015

Issue:

After reviewing the Carroll County Health Department's (CCHD) County and Core Funding Budgets with staff, we determined the fiscal year 2016 budget was \$420,000 short of supporting programs and staffing at fiscal year 2015 levels. Some programs at the Health Department are being reduced or eliminated in order to balance our budget. This shortage was primarily created because the Health Department is an off-budget agency and does not automatically receive increases in funding when the State approves salary increases for employees.

Background:

The overall CCHD budget is approximately \$15 million. Most of this funding is dedicated to specific programs where the money must be spent. Of the overall budget, approximately \$2.9 million is funded by Carroll County and approximately \$1.5 million is State Core Funds. The County and Core funds are the only sources of revenue the Health Officer has discretion in spending on Public Health priorities. Core funds may only be spent on specific "core" areas of public health and have been trending downward since 2008.

The CCHD budget is primarily composed of staffing related expenses. Operational expenses are a very small portion of the budget. This year's approval of raises by the State for staff was the first in four (4) years and in fact employees had been furloughed for some of those years. The CCHD has no control over when the legislature does or does not approve raises for staff and being an off-budget agency has to find ways to fund increases which are not automatically provided. This is even further complicated when some of our categorical grants or other State funding is level funded or reduced. We must often use money from County and Core funds to fill gaps to continue these programs.

In order to cover our gap for the current fiscal year, we have taken the following steps:

- Eliminated the vacant Management Associate Position that supports the Health Officer, Deputy Health Officer, Administrator, and Administration Bureau;
- Eliminated the CCHD's Audiology Program;
- Eliminated a Nursing Position in The Communicable Disease Program;
- Eliminated a full-time equivalent community health educator position who was responsible for Lamaze classes, Another Chance Teen Pregnancy Support Groups, Outreach Education in the Community College, and part of CCHD's support for Caring Carroll;
- Eliminated an Environmental Health Specialist position in the Environmental Health Bureau;
- Consolidated billing, fiscal, and purchasing operations centralizing them in the Bureau of Administration. In doing this we are eliminating a full-time position.
- Used a \$30,000 grant from MDE that was meant to offset the additional staff time required to implement more complex MDE regulatory requirements to cover the gap without increasing staffing in this area.

We have met with the hospital and have also discussed these issues with other community partners in order to attempt to make the minimal impact on services provided to the community. The following is what we believe the impact of the above reductions will be:

- The burden for coordinating schedules and administrative support for the personnel who would have been supported by the Management Associate will now fall on them directly. This will detract slightly from their attention to their primary functions, but should reasonably be able to be absorbed. This may cause delays in coordinating meetings and immediately responding to telephone calls for these staff, as they will need to return calls and do their own coordination.
- The CCHD will no longer have an audiology clinic. Audiology services can generally be obtained through private providers. We have developed a list of places where we can refer clients. Clients who had previously used the CCHD for these services may be unhappy to have to seek a private provider, but we will offer them support and guidance in the transition.
- The loss of a nursing position in the Communicable Disease Program will slow tracking of reportable diseases and make it necessary for other staff to absorb tracking and reporting duties.
- The CCHD will no longer be offering Lamaze classes. These classes were offered without charge. Carroll Hospital Center offers classes for a fee. We discussed with hospital staff the possibility of the Hospital offering free or reduced fee classes for clients who cannot afford to pay. The Community College will likely pick up the portion of the outreach we provided for their students with their internal staff. The Another Chance Teen Pregnancy Support Groups will be discontinued. The Health Department is reducing, but not eliminating, staffing support to Caring Carroll.
- The reduction of staff in Environmental Health will cause longer permit processing times and
 potentially longer times between requesting and providing inspection services. This could
 also lead to the CCHD not meeting inspection frequencies required in the Code of Maryland
 Regulations. We do not plan to discontinue any of the services currently provided in the
 Bureau.
- We plan to improve efficiencies in our billing, fiscal, and purchasing departments by centralizing staff and employing an electronic health record. We will not know the actual impact until the changes are implemented, but are hopeful the efficiencies gained will offset the reduction in staffing.

The CCHD has often struggled to figure out how to cover funding gaps that come with little notice of changes in funding from the State and Federal level. We have applied for a grant to support a strategic planning process which will allow us to prioritize our public health activities and impacts on the community, so that we can be better prepared to handle sudden changes in funding or take advantages of unexpected opportunities. The CCHD will need to go through this process with or without the grant funding because further funding reductions will cause significant reductions in programs at the CCHD and impact the community. We continue to look for ways to partner with other organizations to provide the most cost-efficient means of delivering critical public health services.
