

SENIOR NUTRITION PROGRAM

Wayne County Office of Nutrition Services make available a well-balanced meal to Livonia residents age 60 years and older for a \$2.25 donation. There are three basic nutrition programs.

Hot Lunch Program: Meals are served Monday through Friday at the Civic Park Senior Center or Brashear Towers in Livonia. Please make your reservations for Lunch at least 24 hours in advance by calling the numbers listed below. Once you have made your reservation you will come into one of the two sites, sign a registration sheet and collect your envelope for lunch donation, sit at one of the tables and wait for lunch to be served. Those needing assistance will be served at their table and everyone else will be called up by table and served cafeteria style.

Liquid Nutrition: For those seniors who have difficulty swallowing solid food due to a debilitating disease or condition. A physician must complete the Wayne County Office of Nutrition Services medical form indicating the person's need for liquid meals. The eligible client or representative will be responsible for picking up the liquid nutrition once a month at a designated site. For additional information, please call 1-800-851-1454

Home-Delivered: For those seniors who are homebound, unable to prepare their own meals or unable to feed themselves. Hot meals are delivered on weekdays, frozen meals are available to clients who cannot prepare food on the weekends. A physician, visiting nurse, family, friend or the senior resident can make the referral for Meals-on Wheels at 1-800-851-1454.

SENIOR CENTER, GROCERY SHOPPING, DOCTOR VAN & WESTLAND MALL SHOPPING SENIOR CENTER TRANSPORTATION BUS (S.C.A.N.)

The Senior Center Transportation Buses provide curb-to-curb rides within the City limit on a donation basis. Rides are available to local shopping districts, grocery stores, Westland Mall (1st & 3rd Thursday 10:30am) and to the Senior Center. Service hours for the Senior Center are Monday thru Friday.

- 1. Senior Center pick up. Buses leave the Senior Center at 8:30am and we ask that you be ready for pick up by 8:30am. Buses return you to your home at 1:00pm Monday -Friday and/or 3:00pm Mondays & Tuesdays and Special Event Days.
- 2. Grocery Shopping Monday-Friday (Locations Vary) depending if you are North or South of 5 Mile Road. Call (734) 466-2555 for shopping locations. Driver will inform riders the amount of time allowed at the store and pickup location at designated time.
- 3. Westland Mall Shopping takes place on the 1st (must have a minimum of 4 riders) & 3rd Thursdays of every month. The bus departs for pickup at 10:30am so please be ready for pickup at that time. Once at the Mall the driver will inform you the amount of time you will be allowed and the pick up location (Usually where you are dropped off).

SENIOR CENTER MEDICAL BUS (734) 466-2555 S.C.A.N.

To make a medical bus reservation, please follow these steps:

- 1. Reservations accepted 90 days in advance on a first come, first served basis.
- 2. Medical Bus is limited to five (5) riders per day. Call for information.
- 3. First morning appointment is 9:30 a.m. and last pick-up to return to home by 2:30 p.m. This medical bus travels one (1) mile outside the Livonia City limit.
- 4. When making your reservation, you must have the time of your appointment, the name, address, telephone number of your doctor.
- 5. You will be asked your name, address, telephone number.
- 6. On the day of your scheduled appointment you must be ready for pick-up from your home one (1) hour ahead of your scheduled appointment time. When you are ready to return home, the doctor's office must call the Center for your return ride home.
- 7. Wheelchair riders must be accompanied and their wheelchair must have footrests and brakes in working order.
- 8. Limited to two (2) round trip medical bus appointments per week.
- 9. Doctor Van runs Monday through Friday 9:30am to the last pick up at 2:30pm

24 HOUR ADVANCE RESERVATIONS ARE REQUIRED FOR ALL BUS SERVICES BY CALLING 734-466-2555. S.C.A.N. (Senior Citizen Achievement Needs).

WE ARE APPROACHING FLU SEASON and want everyone to stay as healthy as possible. We ask that you review the "Universal Precautions" that are suggested by the Center for Disease Control. There are hand sanitizers located in every room at the Senior Center. Please feel free to use them.

- Wash your hands after using the toilet, use soap and warm water. It is recommended that you wash for a minimum of 20 seconds (About the time it would take you to sing "Happy Birthday.")
- Cough and sneeze into your elbow, not your hands.

- Throw away your own tissues and paper towels after use.
- Put your name on your coffee cup and keep it with you.





LPS teachers surprised by classroom grant awards

It was a caravan of good news and smiling faces as the LPS Education Foundation took to the streets of the school district to surprise 16 teachers with classroom grants.

The LPS Education Foundation received 52 grant requests, totaling \$148,000, and was able to award 16 grants, totaling \$37,500. Now in its third year, the grant program is supported by the LPS Education Foundation's designated funds, community contributions and employee payroll deductions to the Foundation.

"As in the previous two years, the grants submitted this year supported the district's mission, vision and curriculum," said Lorna Durand, the Foundation's grants program chairperson. "Also as in previous years, the proposals detailed innovative classroom enhancements and were very exciting to review."

Awardees include Cooper Upper Elementary Media Specialist Judy Bowling, who is leading the charge to create a "Makerspace" just off of the library media center at the school. The room will foster innovation and creativity and will feature a variety of hands-on materials that will allow students to create and learn. The grant will fund the purchase of two 3-D printers for Cooper's Makerspace.

Other grants will be used to enhance classroom technology, phonics and literacy projects at the elementary level, high school AP history materials and high school orchestra chamber music purchases at Churchill High School, for example.

Durand said it's often difficult for the grant committee members to decide, but that it's very exciting to present the awardees with their over-sized checks, knowing that their ideas on paper are on their way to fruition to benefit the students of Livonia Public Schools.

The grant program is just one of several programs of the LPS Education Foundation, which raises funds all year, through community business partnerships and support, the annual fall luncheon event, the LPS Bounce Back to School event, as well as LPS employee contributions. Grant provides stewardship plan for Frost Middle School's forest



The constant hum of a busy freeway and the bursts of bustling activity of 700 students coming and going, provide an unlikely daily cadence for this forest.

Situated behind Frost Middle School, along Stark Road and north of the Jeffries Freeway, is a wooded oasis that is home to wildlife, mature trees, a plethora of vegetation and an outdoor classroom where students can learn and explore.

The 12-acre forest on Livonia Public Schools property abuts nearly 30 additional acres of woodlands, right in the middle of Livonia.

While its location may seem unusual, there is nothing odd about this forest, according to David Kossak, a registered forester who was contracted to create a Forest Stewardship Plan through the Michigan Department of Natural Resources' Forest Stewardship Program.

"He pointed out a red oak that is a minimum of 150 years old," said Frost Middle School science teacher Carim Calkins, who worked alongside Kossak to develop the 15-year Forest Stewardship Plan. "He thought it was astonishing to see that in the middle of this densely developed area."

In mid-summer, it's easy to tune out the freeway noise and all of the business and residential development in the area when standing amid the trees. "It's really nice, because in the middle of the summer, you can't see anything but forest," said Calkins.

Michigan has 9.2 million acres of private forest land. The Michigan DNR's Forest Stewardship Program, which is funded through the U.S. Forest Service, helps private forest property owners to manage and protect the forests, for future generations to enjoy. Until this fall, when the Frost Middle School forest property was studied and a plan was created by Kossak, Wayne County was the only county in the state with no Forest Stewardship Plan in place, anywhere within its boundaries.

The Frost plan was recently completed through a grant from the DNR, marking the 83rd and final county in Michigan to have such a plan in place – and, appropriately marking the program's 25th anniversary this year.

The stewardship plan contains goals and objectives and provides a road map for students, including those in the Frost Environmental Club, to continue the long-standing work in the forest.

Creating the current outdoor classroom was the work of the students, parents, and teachers in Frost's MACAT gifted program a decade ago. Since that time, the Environmental Club, facilitated by Calkins and managed by students and parents, has done much of the maintenance and upkeep of the classroom and trail.

"This (stewardship plan) has alerted us to more possibilities of what we can do, but it will take some time to work them into the curriculum," said Calkins.
