BASIC POLICE MOUNTAIN BIKE SCHOOL

"COPSHOCK" – SURVIVING THE EMOTIONAL
REPERCUSSIONS OF LAW ENFORCEMENT ACTIVITY

INSTRUCTOR: LaMaurice H. Gardner, Psy.D., Police Psychologist.

RATIONALE FOR COURSE: This two day course was developed to address officer response to Critical Incidents or "Toxic" experiences that have the potential to emotionally cripple officers and to address the "corrosive" or cumulative effects of the job that assault officers every day.

DESCRIPTION: The law enforcement community explicitly rewards traits such as physical toughness, independence, emotional restriction, and the ability to instrumentally react in the face of traumatic events. However, it is unquestionable that police and support personnel face specific psychological distress on the job as a result of exposure to emotionally Toxic and Corrosive situations. As a result, many officers suffer high rates of depression, anxiety, stress, anger management problems, and relationship difficulties. At times, the level of critical incident stress and occupational stress leads to Post Traumatic Stress Disorder, Major Depression, Substance Abuse, Alcoholism and at worst, Suicide. However, by studying and understanding potential emotional and physical reactions to critical incidents and providing insight into management of the everyday organizational stressors, officers can develop the personal and social resilience to truly survive and grow in the Law Enforcement profession.

GOAL: Participants will recognize and normalize the cognitive, emotional and physical responses that often accompany exposure to critical incidents. They will also learn psychological strategies that will inoculate them from the psychological hazards of exposure to trauma. Further, participants will develop the resources, competencies and "emotional survival mindset" which will help them maintain balance in the presence of daily organizational stress.

OBJECTIVES: Through lecture, reading assignments, video tapes and guest speaker personal accounts, participants will explore the causes and effects of the "emotional injuries" common to the profession of Law Enforcement. They will actively address the often overlooked and taboo subject of stress reactions and in doing so will gain valuable insight and will become more likely to seek and/or providing emotional support.

About the Training

Crisis Intervention is NOT psychotherapy; rather, it is a specialized acute emergency mental health intervention which requires specialized training. As physical first aid is to surgery, crisis intervention is to psychotherapy. Thus, crisis intervention is sometimes called “emotional first aid”. This course is designed to teach participants the fundamentals of, and a specific protocol for, individual crisis intervention. Training includes workbook, breakfast snacks, beverages, and afternoon snacks for both days.

This beginning/intermediate course is designed for anyone who desires to increase their knowledge of individual (one-on-one) crisis intervention techniques in the fields of business & industry, crisis Intervention, disaster response, education, law enforcement, emergency services, dispatch, employee assistance, healthcare, homeland security, mental health, military, spiritual care, and traumatic stress.

Roxanne Affholter

Roxanne is the owner and founder of Crisis Response Connection, and has had extensive training in crisis intervention and disaster response. She received her BA in Communication from Regent University. Throughout her studies, she focused on trauma and its impact on the lives of individuals. She has also completed over 250 learning hours of training through the International Critical Incident Stress Foundation (ICISF). This training included emphases on group and individual crisis intervention, suicide, grief, domestic terrorism, mass disasters, line of duty death, and crisis management for law enforcement. Roxanne is also an approved ICISF instructor for basic group crisis intervention, individual/peer crisis intervention, and CISM law enforcement perspectives.

Currently Roxanne is a board member of the Michigan Crisis Response Association (MCRA), and the team coordinator for both the Midland-Gladwin County and Great Lakes Critical Incident Stress Management (CISM) teams. She has been a member of the Midland-Gladwin team since 2006, and led the exploratory committee overseeing the recent formation of the Great Lakes team. Roxanne believes passionately that CISM can play an important role in responding to both community and first responder level trauma. As such, she sees it as an integral component of psychologically healthy communities.

Compelled by her desire to help build healthy communities, Roxanne has become a CISM advocate and consultant. She has raised awareness of CISM's capacity to mitigate the negative effects of trauma within the community and amongst first responders, at both the local and state levels.

8. Practice the SAFER-Revised model of individual psychological crisis intervention.
9. Understand how the SAFER-Revised model may be altered for suicide intervention.
10. Understand and discuss the risks of iatrogenic “harm” associated with psychological crisis intervention and will further discuss how to reduce those risks.

SAFER Model

- **Stabilize** (introduction; meet basic needs; mitigate acute stressors)
- **Acknowledge** the crisis (event, reactions)
- **Facilitate** understanding (normalization)
- **Encourage** effective coping (mechanisms of action)
- **Recovery or Referral** (facilitate access to continued care)

Course Title: Michigan Motor Vehicle Electronic Insurance Verification system access, interpretation, and enforcement/ Counterfeit Proof of Insurance Certificate Recognition and Investigation

Why use Non-Destructive Entry (NDE)?

NDE offers an alternate option to a forced entry. Techniques such as lock picking can allow patrol officers, supervisors, command officers, detectives, surveillance/narcotic officers and special response/SWAT teams a covert and non-destructive entry method.
