



Population

In 2010-2012, Los Angeles County, California had a total population of 9.9 million - 5.0 million (51 percent) females and 4.9 million (49 percent) males. The median age was 35.0 years. Twenty-four percent of the population was under 18 years and 11 percent was 65 years and older.




For people reporting one race alone, 56 percent were White; 9 percent were Black or African American; less than 0.5 percent were American Indian and Alaska Native; 14 percent were Asian; less than 0.5 percent were Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander, and 21 percent were Some other race. Four percent reported Two or more races. Forty-eight percent of the people in Los Angeles County, California were Hispanic. Twenty-seven percent of the people in Los Angeles County, California were White non-Hispanic. People of Hispanic origin may be of any race.

Education

In 2010-2012, 21 percent of people 25 years and over had a high school diploma or equivalency and 30 percent had a bachelor's degree or higher. Twenty-four percent were dropouts; they were not enrolled in school and had not graduated from high school.

The total school enrollment in Los Angeles County, California was 2.8 million in 2010-2012. Nursery school and kindergarten enrollment was 293,000 and elementary or high school enrollment was 1.6 million children. College or graduate school enrollment was 866,000.




Households and Families

In 2010-2012 there were 3.2 million households in Los Angeles County, California. The average household size was 3.0 people.

Families made up 67 percent of the households in Los Angeles County, California. This figure includes both marriedcouple families (44 percent) and other families (23 percent). Of other families, 8 percent are female householder families with no husband present and own children under 18 years. Nonfamily households made up 33 percent of all households in Los Angeles County, California. Most of the nonfamily households were people living alone, but some were composed of people living in households in which no one was related to the householder.

In Los Angeles County, California, 37 percent of all households have one or more people under the age of 18; 24 percent of all households have one or more people 65 years and over.



Poverty and Participation in Government Programs

In 2010-2012, 18 percent of people were in poverty. Twenty-six percent of related children under 18 were below the poverty level, compared with 13 percent of people 65 years old and over. Fifteen percent of all families and 28 percent of families with a female householder and no husband present had incomes below the poverty level.
