Significant Events:

- M7.4 earthquake Mexico
- Severe weather Texas, Louisiana, Arkansas

Significant Weather:

- Slight risk of severe thunderstorms, heavy rain, flooding Lower to Middle Mississippi Valley
- Heavy snow possible Cascades and Northern Rockies
- Above normal temperatures eastern U.S.
- Red Flag Warnings: New Mexico and Texas
- Critical Fire Weather Areas: None

TX and LA Severe Weather


<u>Texas</u>

- March 19: NWS confirmed EF1 & EF2 tornadoes in Medina County and an EF2 tornado in Bexar County.
- · According to media reports:
 - 50 homes damaged & 5 injured in Medina County.
 - Roofs damaged and power lines downed in Bexar Co. (35,000 w/o power at peak; full power restoration expected March 21)
- 1 ARC shelter / 13 occupants (NSS March 21 6:00am)
- TX EOC not activated; no requests for FEMA assistance

Louisiana

- March 20: Two unconfirmed tornado sightings
- 6-10" of rain fell over several parishes past 12 hrs; an additional 1-2" per hour likely for next several hours
- Flash flooding/flooding expected in many areas.
- Numerous roads closed/impassable in many areas
- State EOC activated at Level III w/CAT; Ops Section monitoring/reporting as needed







AR Severe Weather



Arkansas


- March 19: Tornado reported in Crawford County, AR
- State EOC reported property damage in Morrilton (pop. 6,767) and Midway (pop. 1,064) due to straight-line winds
- In Morrilton:
 - High wind destroyed two storage buildings and damaged at least 25 homes
 - 3,000 customers without power
- Midway: 12 homes damaged in mobile home park
- No injuries reported and no shelters open
- Arkansas EOC not activated
- No requests for FEMA assistance






National Weather Forecast






Active Watches/Warnings






Precipitation Forecast Day 1 - 3






Significant River Flood Outlook






Convective Outlook Days 1 - 3









Critical Fire Weather Areas Days 1 - 8





Hazard Outlook – March 23-27











Earthquake Activity – Mexico

FEMA

Oaxaca, Mexico

- M7.4 earthquake at 2:02 p.m. EDT, March 20, 2012
 - Depth of 12.4 miles
 - 15 miles E of Ometepec, Guerrero, Mexico
 - 84 miles SSW of Huajuapan de Leon, Oaxaca, MX
 - 200 miles SSE of Mexico City, Mexico
- Minor damages reported in Mexico City & Oaxaca City
- Media reports more than 800 homes damaged or collapsed in the towns of Igualapa and Ometepec.
- Telephone/ power service disruptions reported in region
- No reports of serious injuries or fatalities
- Mexico City airport closed briefly but has reopened
- Mexico health system reported operating normally
- Nuclear power plant in Veracruz unaffected; remains fully operational.
- Numerous aftershocks ranging from M4.6 to 5.3
- · No tsunami generated
- No request for FEMA assistance; none anticipated









Direct Housing per State






