- Eastern Pacific: Hurricane Bud (Cat 2)
- Western Pacific: No activity affecting U.S. interests

#### **Significant Weather:**

- Scattered rain & thunderstorms Northern Tier states (through Sunday); southern Florida & Carolina coasts
- Severe thunderstorms possible Central Great Plains, Middle Mississippi Valley & Northeast
- Critical Fire Weather Areas / Red Flag Warnings: CA, NV, AZ, NM, CO, UT & TX
- Space Weather: No space weather storms occurred/predicted



#### Atlantic – Tropical Outlook






#### As of 4:25 a.m. EDT

- Broad area of low pressure located near northwestern Bahamas
- Environmental conditions expected to become more conducive for formation of subtropical or tropical cyclone by Sat or Sun
- Moving northeast at 15 mph next 24-48 hrs, then gradual turn back toward west on Sat
- High chance (70%) of becoming tropical or subtropical cyclone next 48 hrs




#### Eastern Pacific – Hurricane Bud (Cat 2)




#### As of 8:00 a.m. EDT

- Located 105 miles SW of Manzanillo, MX
- Moving NNE at 8 mph
- Turn north and decrease in forward speed next 24-36 hrs
- General turn to west on Sunday
- Expected to make landfall in the hurricane warning area tonight
- Max sustained winds 110 mph with higher gusts
- Category 2 hurricane; some weakening forecast but is expected to make landfall as a hurricane
- Hurricane force winds extend 35 miles; Tropical Storm force winds extend 115 miles
- Tropical storm & hurricane watches/warnings in effect for coast of Mexico








### High Temperatures – May 26-27





## Precipitation Forecast 1 - 3 Day






#### River Flood Outlook – 7 Day






## Convective Outlook Days 1 - 3






### Critical Fire Weather Areas Days 1 - 8







#### Drought Monitor as of May 22, 2012






#### **National Preparedness Level: 2**

Several Geographic Areas are experiencing high to extreme fire danger. Wild land fire activity is increasing, and large fires are occurring in one (1) or more Geographic Areas. Minimal mobilization of resources from other Geographic Areas is occurring. There is moderate commitment of National Resources with the potential to mobilize additional resources from other Geographic Areas.

- Mandatory evacuations remain in effect for Crown King, Pine Flats, Turkey Creek & Battle Flats areas
- Governor declared a state of emergency for Yavapai County May 23
- ▲ 990 (-156) personnel on scene, including Type I IMT
- ▲ Containment lines held despite Red Flag conditions
- Yavapai County EOC remains activated; AZ EOC remains at normal ops
- FEMA Region IX RRCC remains at Watch/Steady State and monitoring



- ▲ Electrical switching station supporting 10K customers threatened; extensive dozer lines in place to protect station
- 2 residences & 17 outbuildings destroyed
- Voluntary evacuations for 300 residents
- Local shelter at TRE Community Center in Douglas County open; unknown number of occupants
- No injuries or fatalities
- Type II IMT assumed command May 24
- △ 595 (+35) personnel on scene
- ▲ Good progress on firelines; no active perimeter growth



- Type II IMT took command May 23
- Type I IMT mobilized May 24
- ▲ 506 personnel on scene
- · State EOC remains at normal operations
- FEMA Region VI RRCC remains at Watch/Steady State







#### IHP Referral Status & Awards




