Significant Activity: Oct 28 – 29



Significant Events: Hurricane Sandy / Major East Coast Storm Tropical Activity:

- Atlantic Hurricane Sandy
- Eastern Pacific Area 1 MEDIUM (50%) chance; Area 2 LOW (20%)
- Central Pacific No tropical cyclones expected through Wednesday morning
- Western Pacific No activity affecting U.S. territories


- High winds, heavy rain & flash flooding Mid-Atlantic and Northeast
- Heavy snow Appalachians & higher elevations of Pacific Northwest
- Hurricane Warnings East Coast
- Critical Fire Weather Areas : FL, AL, GA
- Red Flag Warnings: FL, AL
- Space Weather: None
- Earthquake Activity: M4.0 Central CA; Aftershocks continue from M7.7 near BC

Atlantic – Hurricane Sandy

As of 8:00 a.m. EDT

- 265 miles SE of Atlantic City, NJ; 310 miles SSE of NYC
- Moving NNW at 20 mph
- Turn NW expected later this morning
- Max sustained winds 85 mph
- Expected to transition into a frontal or wintertime low pressure system prior to landfall; a little strengthening is possible but expected to weaken after moving inland
- Will move over Mid-Atlantic coast this evening or tonight
- Hurricane force winds extend 175 miles; Tropical Storm force winds extend 485 miles
- TS Warning in effect north of Surf City to Duck, NC; Pamlico and Albemarle sounds
- High Wind Watches/Warnings in effect for the Mid-Atlantic States & New England








Eastern Pacific – Area 1 (Invest 98E)






Eastern Pacific – Area 1

- 700 miles SW of Manzanillo, Mexico
- Moving WNW at 10-15 mph
- Less favorable for development
- MEDIUM (50%) chance of becoming tropical cyclone next 48 hours






Eastern Pacific – Area 2

As of 8:00 a.m. EDT


- 500 miles S of Manzanillo, Mexico
- Moving slowly WNW
- Less favorable for development
- LOW (20%) chance of becoming tropical cyclone next 48 hours

- Region IV IMAT deployed to NC

State Impacts/ Response

- NC EOC: Level I (Full Activation) 24/7; NC Governor declared State of Emergency
- ▲ FL EOC: returned to Normal Operations

- RWC at Enhanced Watch
 - RRCC at Level II (Partial Activation)
- LNOs deployed to VA, MD, & PA
- Non-disaster staff will telework Oct 29 & 30
- Region VII DCE deployed to Baltimore, MD
 - Region VI DCE deployed to Richmond, VA
- USGS deployed field crew to Delmarva Peninsula

Regional IMAT deployments

- Region III IMAT 1 deployed to PA
- Region III IMAT 2 deployed to DE
- Region V IMAT deployed to MD
- Region VI IMAT deployed to VA

State Impacts/ Response

- ▲ State of Emergency declared for VA, MD, PA & DC
- VA EOC: Increased Readiness (Hurricane Condition III); 15 shelters/239 occupants
- ▲ MD EOC: Level I (Full Activation); 18 shelters/216 occupants
- PA EOC: Enhanced operations; 11 shelters/69 occupants
- ▲ DC EOC: Level IV (Full Activation, highest is Level V); 7 shelters /378 occupants
- ▲ WV EOC: Full Activation at noon today
- ▲ DE EOC: Full Activation

Regional Response

- ▲ RRCC at Level I (Full Activation) with ESFs 1 15 & DCE
- Mandatory evacuations are in effect for NJ & MY
- LNOs deployed to NJ, NYC & NY (Albany)
- ISB established at Joint Base McGuire/Dix/Lakehurst

Regional IMAT deployment

- Region II IMAT deployed to NY (Albany)
- Region VII IMAT deployed to NJ (Earle)

State Impacts/ Response

- State of Emergency declared for NY and NJ
- NY State EOC: Full Activation (Level I with possible NRF coordination); 22 shelters/756 occupants
- ▲ NJ State EOC: Full Activation; 10 shelters/538 occupants
- NYC OEM: Full Activation (Level I)

- ▲ RRCC at Level I (Full Activation) w/all ESFs, DOD & NWS
- LNOs deployed to MA and RI EMAs
- Region IX DCE deployed to Region I
- Commodities staged at ISB Westover AFB, MA

- Region I IMAT deployed to RI
- Region IV IMAT 2 deployed to NH
- ▲ Region VIII IMAT deployed to CT
- Region IX IMAT deployed to VT

State Impacts/ Response

- CT EOC: Full Activation, 24/7 operations; state of emergency declared; 18 shelters/115 occupants
- MA EOC: Full activation; state of emergency declared; 5 shelters/no occupants
- RI EOC: Full Activation; 24/7; 9 shelters/10 occupants
- ▲ VT EOC: Full Activation
- ▲ NH EOC: Full Activation
- ME EOC: Monitoring; Limited emergency declaration for power restoration




FEMA Region III Hurricane SANDY Sustainment as of 10/28/12 0100 EDT









Tropical Storm Sandy Precipitation Forecast **FEMA**






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Precipitation Forecast Days 1-3






River Flood Outlook – 7 Day






Convective Outlook Days 1-3





Critical Fire Weather Areas Days 1 - 8







