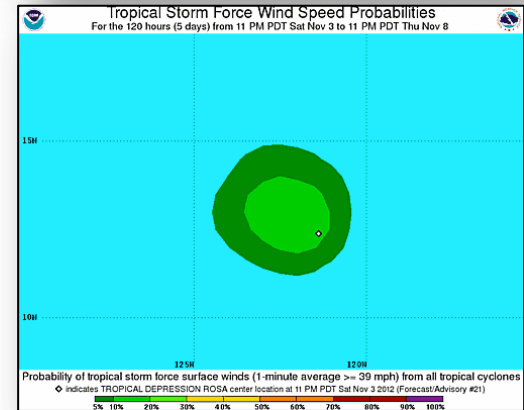
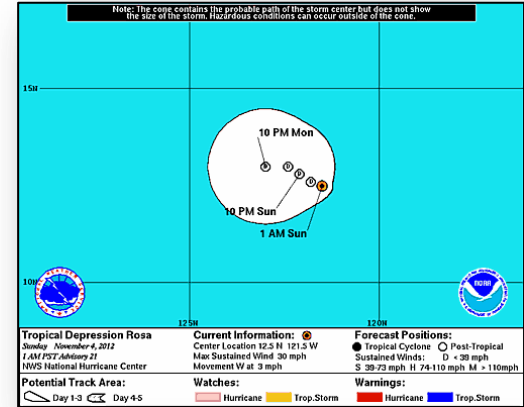


# Eastern Pacific – Tropical Depression Rosa

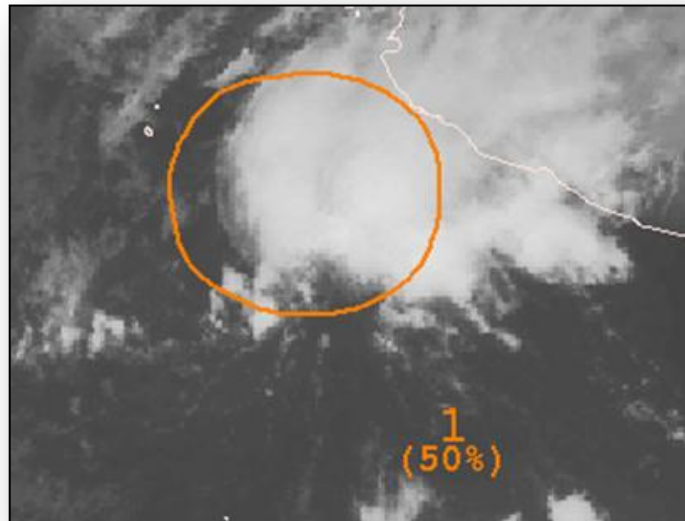

- Weakening forecast during next 48 hours; expected to degenerate into remnant low by today



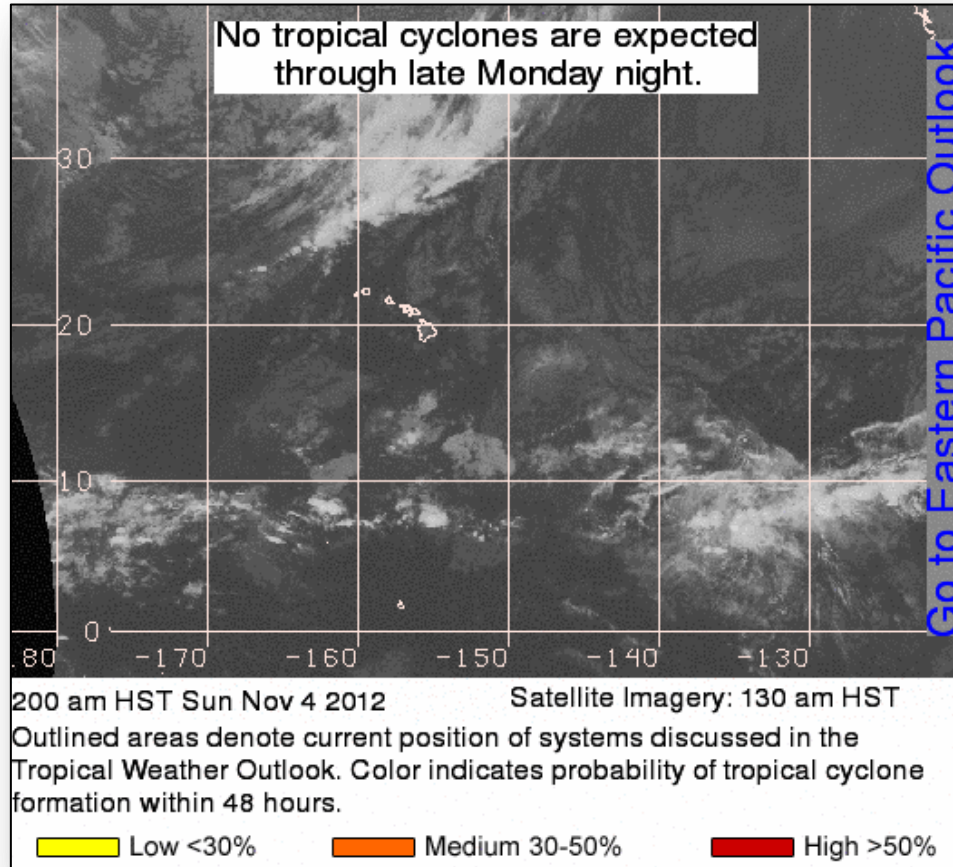

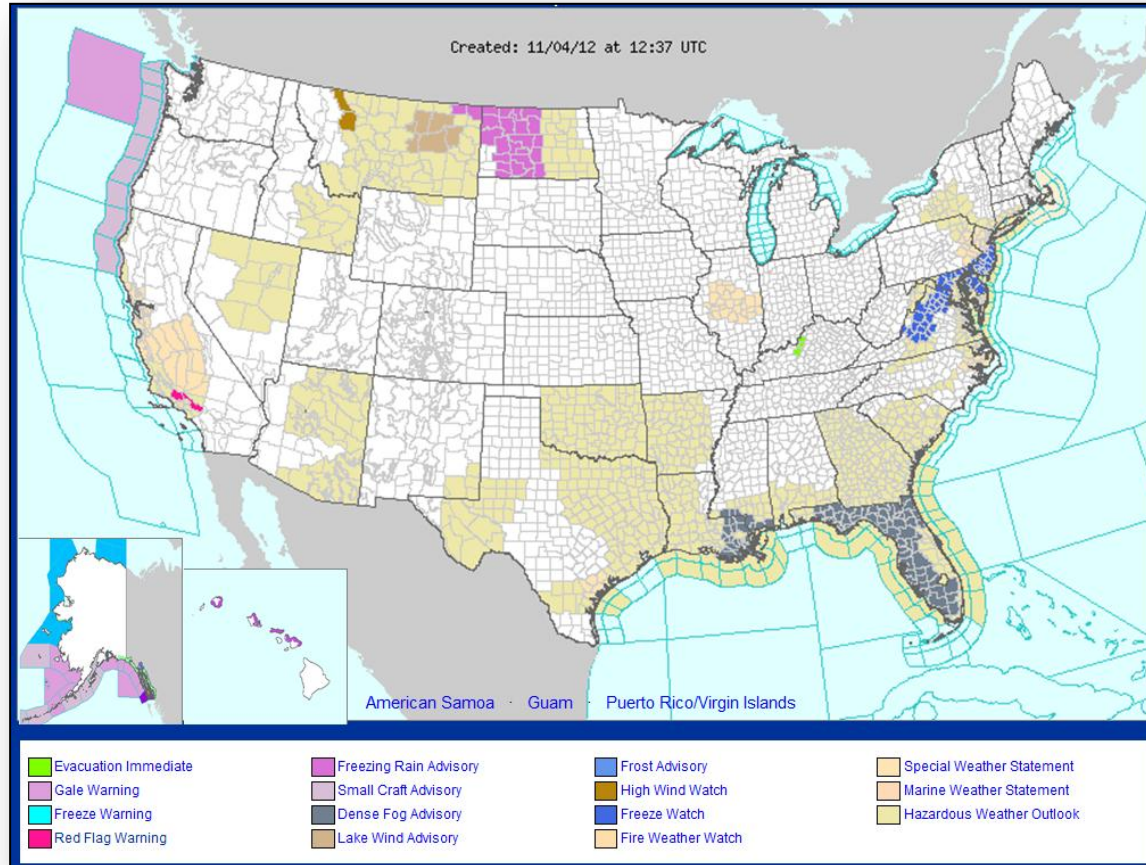

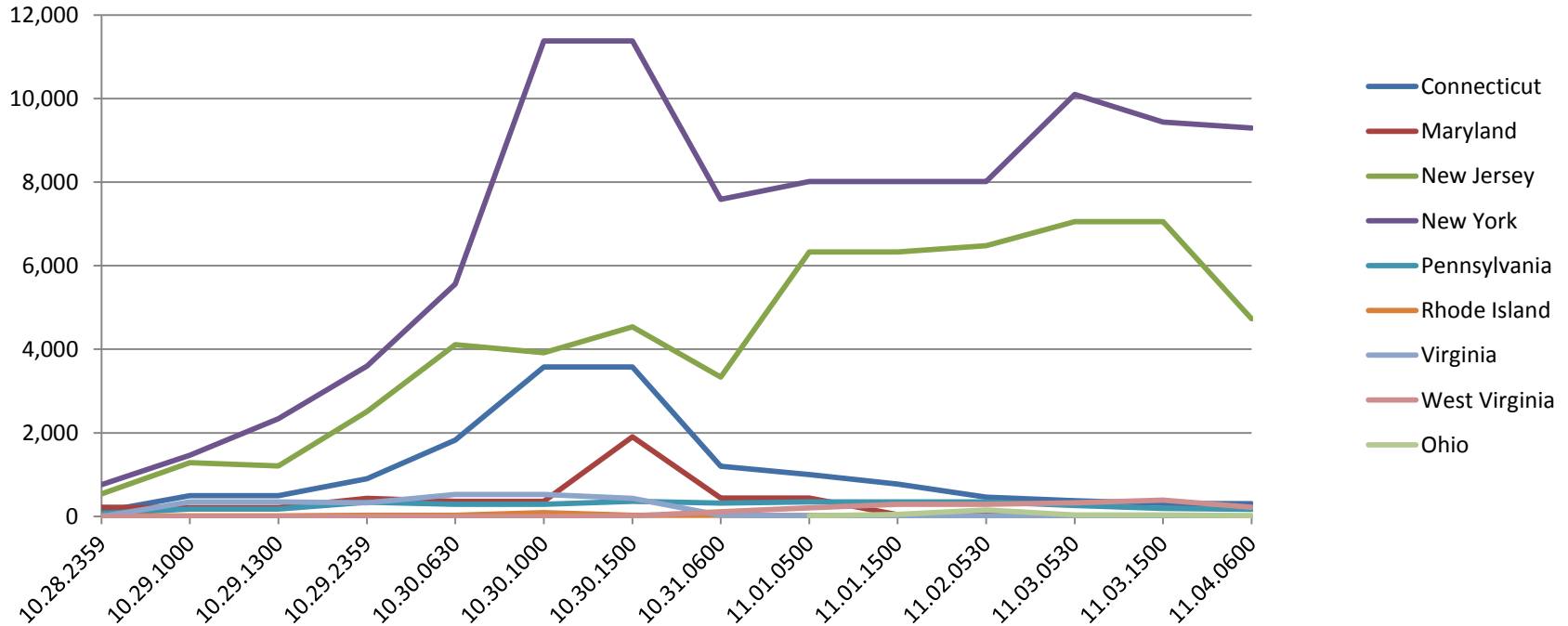
# Hurricane Sandy-Power Outages



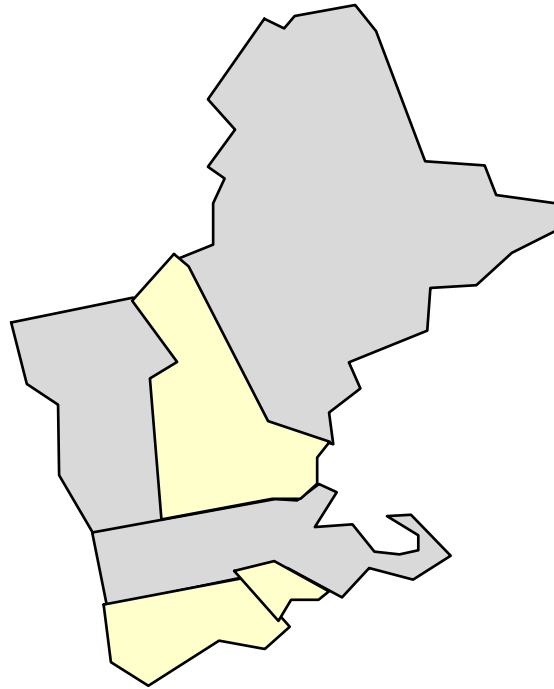

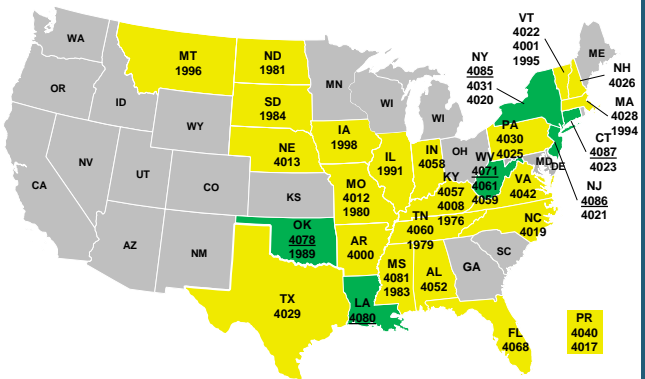

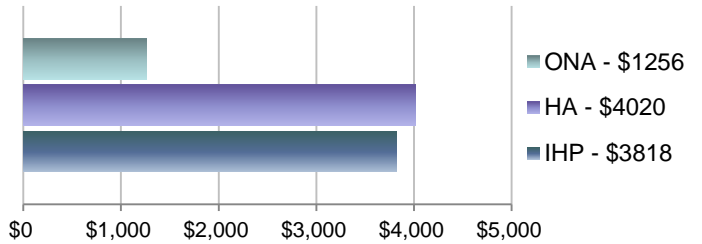
