- Winter Storm Arkansas

Significant Weather

- Snow forecast from the Central/Southern Rockies to the upper Ohio Valley
 - Heavy snow is expected from CO to MO
- Thunderstorms along the Gulf Coast
- Critical Fire Weather Areas: None
- Red Flag Warnings: None
- Space Weather: No space weather storms observed or predicted

Tropical Activity: No activity threatening U.S. territories

Earthquake Activity: No significant activity

Winter Storm Impacts, Dec 25-29

Situation

- Strong winds, tornados & heavy snow caused damage & power outages in AR, TX, LA, MS & AL
- Power restored to majority of customers in all states with the exception of AR
- Local damage assessments continue
- All state EOCs at normal operations
- No requests for FEMA assistance

Arkansas

- Winter storms brought strong winds, freezing rain and heavy snow to portions of AR
- Governor declared a statewide disaster on December 26
- ▲ 12,600 (-23,600) customer power outages (peak: 200,000) (Entergy; 7:30 a.m., Dec 31)
- ▲ 3 shelters with 48 occupants (ESF 6; 7 a.m. Dec 31)
- No critical facilities without power
- Out of state power crews aiding in restoration effort
- No fuel shortages reported

- 4,185 FEMA personnel are deployed supporting Sandy-related recovery operations across 11 states and District of Columbia
 - 14 Major Disaster Declarations; 13 Emergency Declarations


New York (State EOC at Level III; Partial Activation)

- △ 3 shelters are open with 151 (-10) occupants (ESF 6, 7 a.m. Dec 31)
- 22 DRCs remain open
- ▲ Debris removal 75% (+2%) complete (approx. 4.4 mil CY removed of 6.01 mil CY total)
- DCE demobilized from the NY Joint Field Office on Dec 28th
- N-IMAT Blue is deployed to NY JFO
- Regional IMATs deployed to NY: R-II, R-IV, R-VIII, R-IX and R-X

New Jersey (State EOC at Level II, Enhanced Ops)

- · 24 DRCs remain open
- Debris removal 30% complete (approx. 3 mil CY removed of 10 mil CY total)
- N-IMAT Red is deployed to NJ JFO
- R-VII IMAT remains deployed to NJ








Active Watches/Warnings






Precipitation Forecast Days 1-3






River Flood Outlook – 7 Day






Convective Outlooks Days 1-3






Critical Fire Weather Areas Days 1 - 8
