# Significant Activity: May 31 – June 3



#### **Significant Events:**

- Severe weather Central U.S. (Final)
- Powerhouse Fire CA

#### **Tropical Activity:**

- Atlantic Area 1 (Low/20%) Invest 91L
- Eastern Pacific No activity expected during the next 48 hours
- Central Pacific No tropical cyclones expected through Tuesday night

#### **Significant Weather:**

- Severe thunderstorms Southern Plains to Northern Plains
- Rain/thunderstorms Northern Intermountain to Northern & Southern Plains, Deep South to Northeast
- Flash flooding Northern Plains
- Red Flag Warnings: AK & CO
- Critical Fire Weather Areas: None
- Space Weather: None observed; none predicted

#### Earthquake Activity: No significant activity

#### **Declaration Activity:**

- FMAG approved Powerhouse Fire, California
- Major Disaster Declaration approved Iowa
- Amendment No. 2 to FEMA-4116-DR-IL

# Severe Weather – Central U.S. (Final)



#### **Summary for May 31 – June 1, 2013**


- Severe storms impacted Southern Plains, Middle Mississippi Valley & Northeast
- NWS received over 300 storm reports, to include 25 possible tornadoes;
- NWS confirms 15 tornadoes across OK, IL & MO; NWS assessments continue
  - Oklahoma 12 (4 EF-0, 6 EF-1, 1 EF-2, 1 EF-3)
  - Illinois 2 (EF-2, EF-3)
  - Missouri 1 (EF-3)

#### Oklahoma:

- JFO's preliminary aerial assessments: 56 structures destroyed & 53 damaged
- 13 confirmed fatalities & 115 injuries (As of 5:45 pm EDT, June 2, OK SitRep)
- 8 (+1) shelters open with 313 (+28) occupants (As of 6:00 am EST, June 3, NSS)
- 24,313 (peak 92,000) customers without power (as of 2:00 am EDT, June 3 DOE)
- Power restored to all hospitals

#### Missouri:

- Media reports 72 homes destroyed, 100 with slight to moderate damages
- 3 confirmed, flood-related fatalities; 6 injuries
- 1 shelter open with 7 occupants (As of 6:00 am EST, June 3, NSS)
- 40,024 (peak, 85,208) customers without power (as of 2:00 am EDT, June 3 DOE)
- DOT reports widespread road closures throughout state due to flooding




#### State / Local Response

- IA SEOC is partially activated; all other states at normal ops
  - IA governor declared disaster proclamation for 20 counties for flooding
- MO governor declared state of emergency May 31 for severe weather
- No unmet needs


#### **FEMA Response**

- Region V RRCC remains at Watch/Steady State, w/IMAT deployed to IL JFO
- Region VI RRCC remains at Watch/Steady State
  - IMAT deployed to OK EOC; LNOs on standby
  - ▲ All field operations, including JFO, suspended until today
- · Region VII RRCC at Level III
  - IMAT, DCO, DCE & 2 state LNOs deployed to IA EOC
  - Tribal LNOs deployed to KS & IA
- Region VIII RRCC at Level III, with IMAT deployed to JFO in ND
- ▲ FEMA Logistics deployments:
  - One 54-pack of generators to FSA at Will Rogers Airport, OK
  - 1 TL cots & 1 TL blankets to JFO in OK (scheduled to have arrived June 1)




### Atlantic – Area 1 (Invest 91L)




### As of 8:00 a.m. EDT

- LOW (20%) chance of becoming a tropical cyclone during the next 48 hours




# Eastern Pacific – Tropical Outlook






# Central Pacific – Tropical Outlook










# Precipitation Forecast Days 1-3






# River Forecast – 7 Day






# Convective Outlooks Days 1-3






# Critical Fire Weather Areas Days 1 - 8








- Fire started May 30; located north of LA in Los Angeles Co.
- Mandatory evacuations for Lake Hughes (R-IX Incident Report No. 9)
- Voluntary evacs remain in place for residents in Lake Elizabeth
- Up to 7,045 residents evacuated; exact number unknown
- 1 shelter w/35 occupants (NSS; 7:00 a.m. EDT)
- 500 kV Edison electrical lines have been shut down as a precaution; grid rerouted for no loss of power
- No impact to health care facilities in affected area
- 2,109 (+1,134) personnel, with Type 2 IMT supporting fire fight
- All EOCs remain at Normal Ops



# Open Field Offices as of June 3, 2013






### Major Disaster Declaration – Iowa




