# Significant Activity: June 25-26



## **Significant Events:**

- Severe Weather Activity – June 25
- Pavlof Volcano Eruption – AK
- Wildfire Activity – CO

## **Tropical Activity:**

- Atlantic – No tropical cyclone activity expected next 48 hours
- Eastern Pacific – Hurricane Cosme (Category 1)
- Central Pacific – No tropical cyclones expected through Thursday night
- Western Pacific – No activity threatening U.S. territories

## **Significant Weather:**

- Severe thunderstorms – Middle & Upper Mississippi Valleys to the Northeast
- Heavy rains – Middle & Upper Mississippi Valleys to the Ohio Valley
- Critical Fire Weather Areas: None; Red Flag Warnings: AK, OK & AR
- Space Weather: No space weather storms observed or predicted

**Earthquake Activity:** No significant activity

## **Declaration Activity:**

- Major Disaster Declarations approved for – Alaska, Arkansas, & the Standing Rock Sioux Tribe
- Amendments to Major Disaster Declarations in New York & New Jersey

# Severe Weather Activity - June 25, 2013



## Overview:

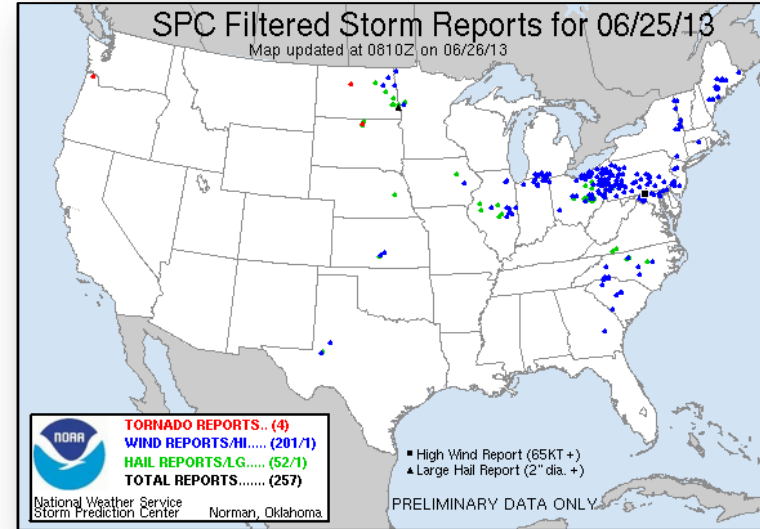
- Severe weather: Strong winds, large hail, heavy rains and unconfirmed tornadoes from Midwest to Mid-Atlantic
- Flash flooding reported in multiple locations

## Impacts:

- No significant impacts reported; reports of minor/scattered property damage
- No fatalities or injuries
- Impacts primarily downed trees & power lines
- 100,461 customers remain without power across affected area:
  - Majority of outages are concentrated in 4 states:
    - IL (16,319)      IN (17,496)
    - OH (29,868)    PA (15,156)
  - Sporadic outages reported elsewhere (*DOE as of 5:30 a.m. EDT*)

## Response:

- All State EOCs remain at Normal Operations
- All affected FEMA Regions remain at Watch/Steady State
- No unmet needs, no requests for FEMA assistance



# Pavlof Volcanic Activity

## June 24, 2013

- Pavlof volcano erupted, sending ash plume 28K feet into atmosphere
- Seismic activity escalating, strongest since eruptions began in May
  - Continuous intense tremors & frequent small explosions
- Could put up more robust ash plumes at any time

## **Impacts:**

- Trace ash fall on King Cove (pop. 938), 30 miles SW of volcano
- Could affect North Pacific aviation routes

## **State/Local Response:**

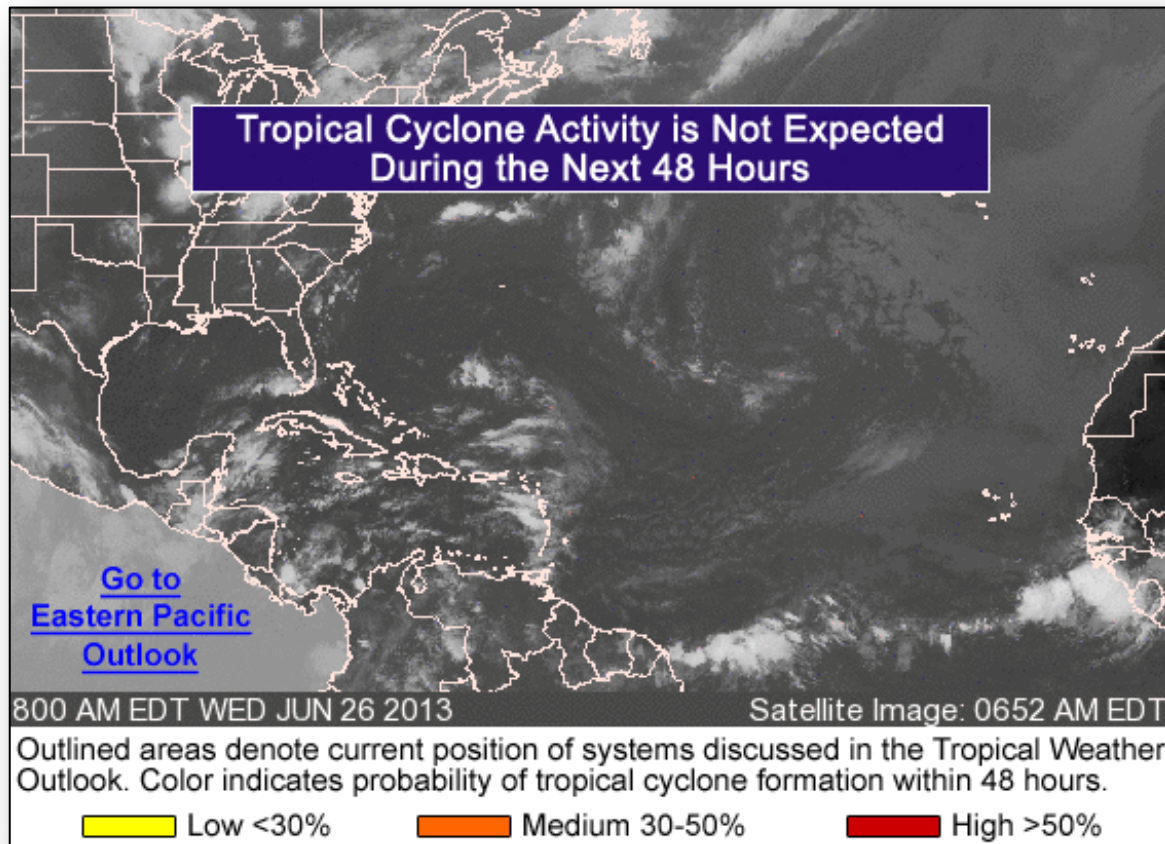
- Alert Level: WATCH; Aviation Color Code: ORANGE (ash plume observed)
- NWS issued an Ashfall Advisory
- Alaska Volcano Observatory (AVO) monitoring closely
- AK EOC at Preparedness Level 3 (flooding)

## **FEMA Response:**

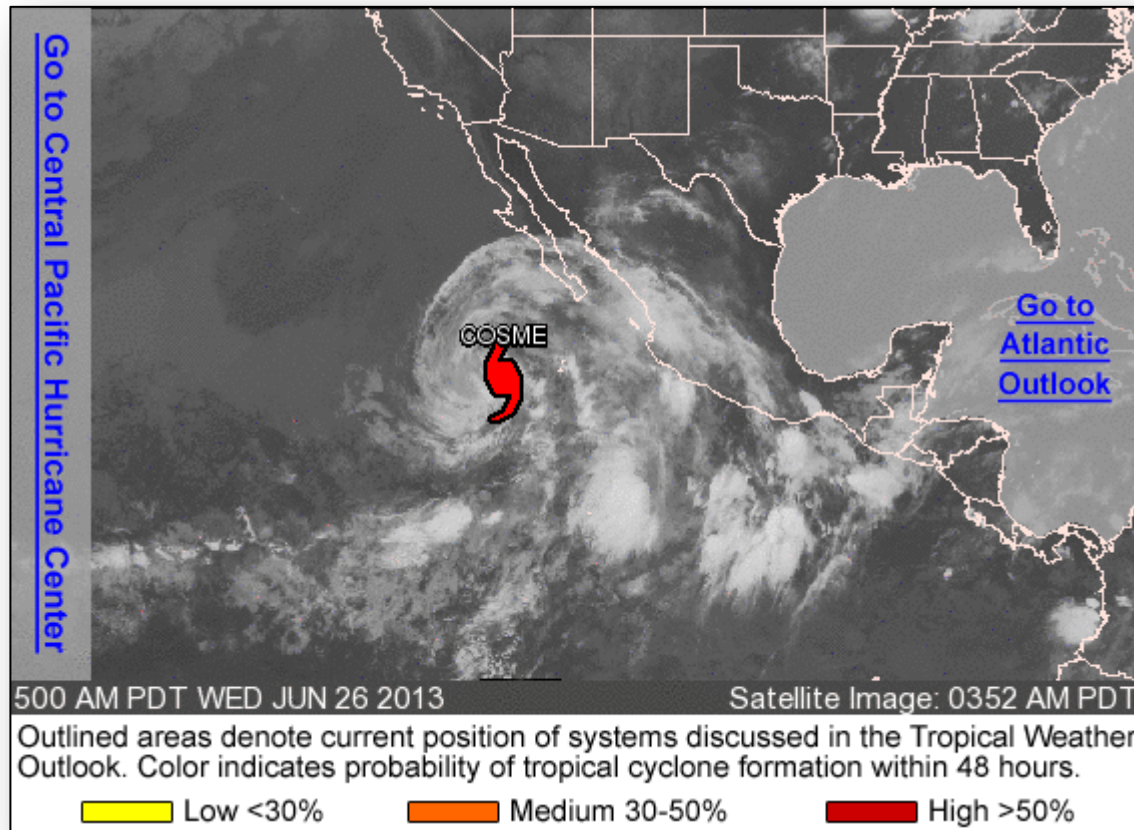
- FEMA Region X remains at Watch/Steady State
- No unmet needs, no requests for FEMA assistance

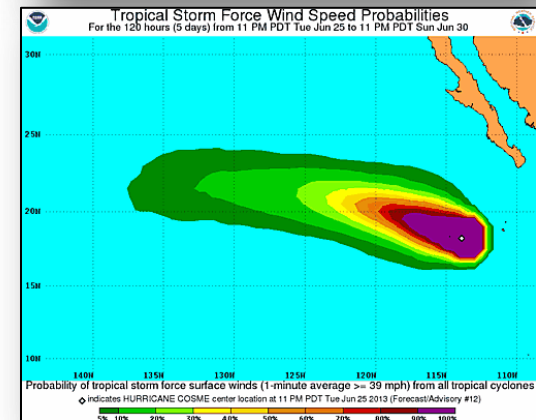
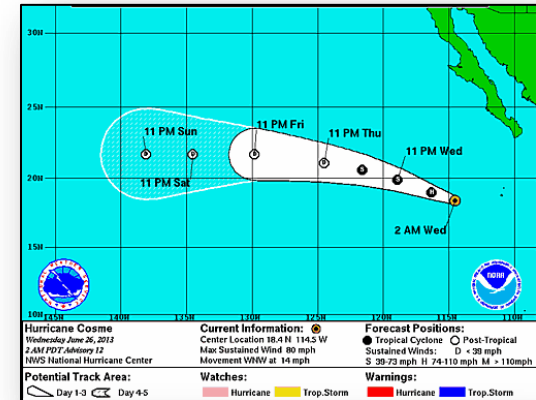


# Eastern Pacific – Hurricane Cosme (CAT-1)

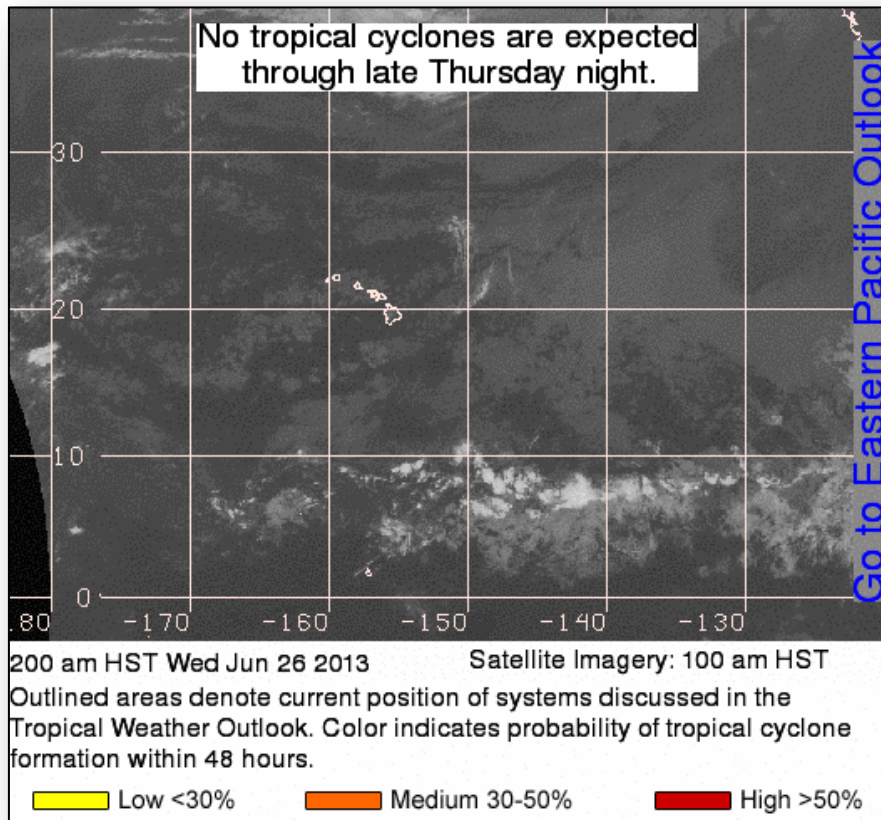


## As of 8:00 a.m. EDT

- Located 430 miles SW of Cabo San Lucas Mexico
- Moving WNW at 14 mph
- Motion expected to continue for the couple of days
- Max sustained winds 80 mph
- Steady weakening forecast during next 48 hours
- Expected to become a tropical storm by tonight; a tropical depression on Thursday
- Hurricane-force winds extend 35 miles
- Tropical storm-force winds extend 150 miles
- No coastal watches or warnings in effect

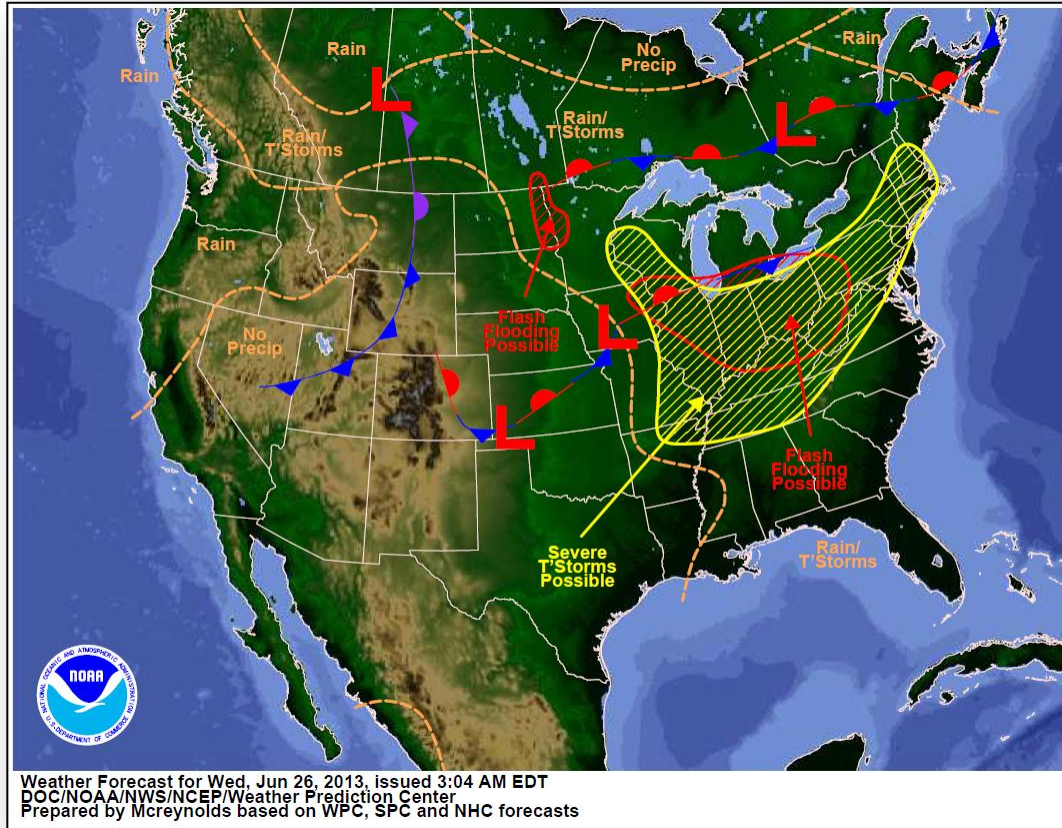

- FCO is Dolph A. Diemont

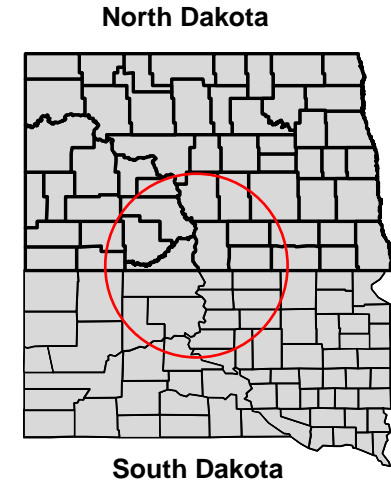


# Major Disaster Declaration Approved – SRST

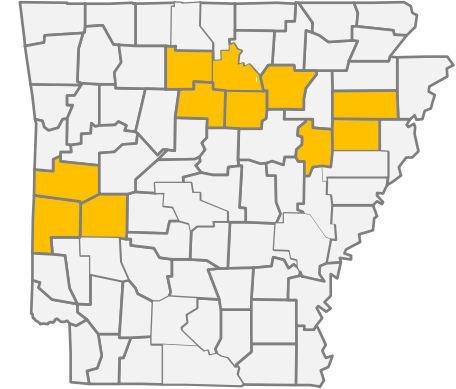
# Major Disaster Declaration Approved – AR

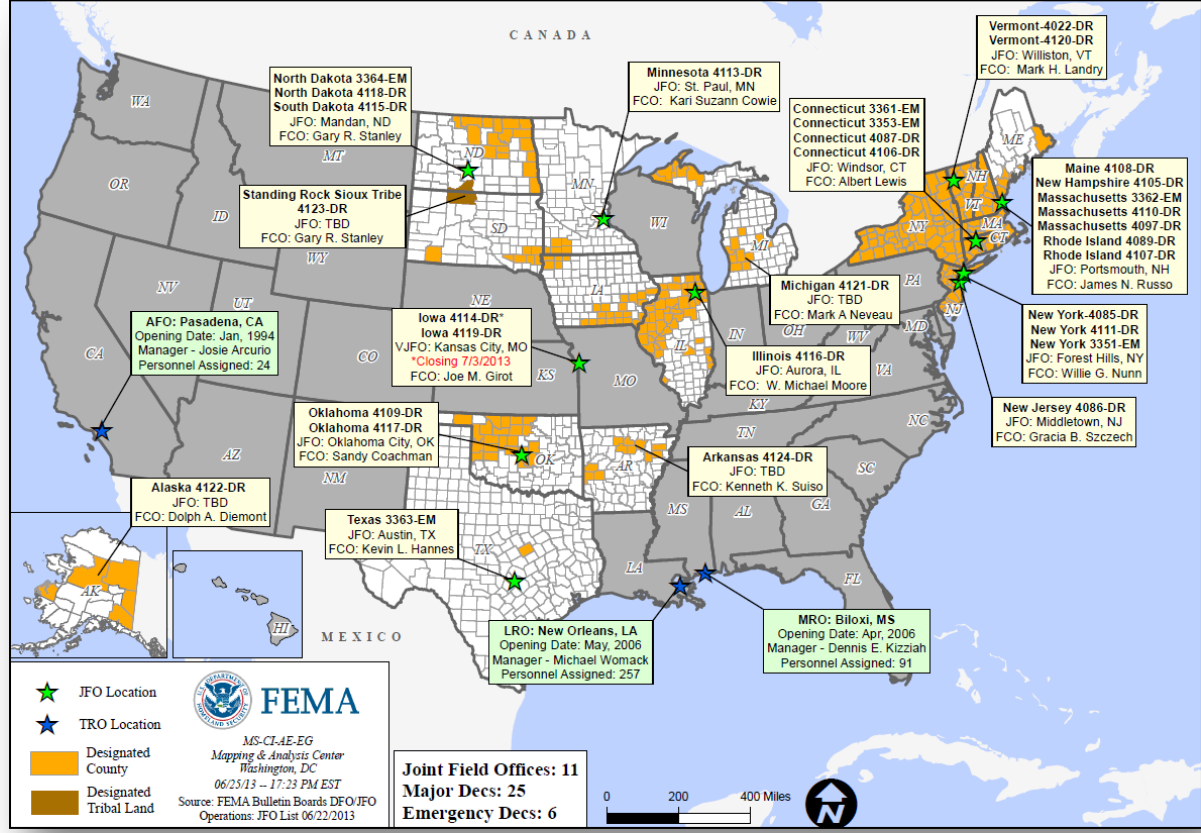

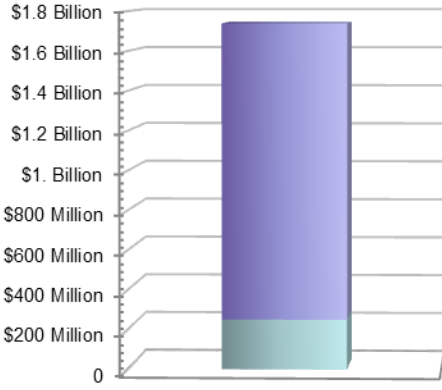

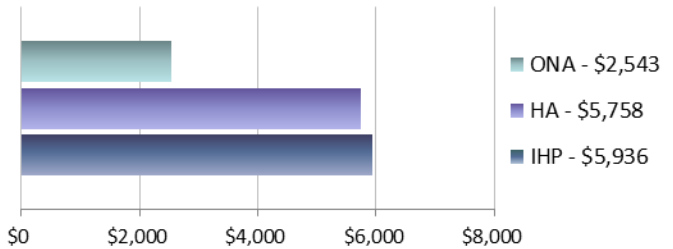
