# Significant Activity: Oct 12-13



**Significant Events:** Southeast Flooding (FINAL)

### **Tropical Activity:**

- Atlantic: Tropical cyclone activity not expected next 48 hours
- Eastern Pacific: Disturbance 1 Low chance (10%)
- Central Pacific: Tropical Storm Nora
- Western Pacific: Tropical Depression 25

### **Significant Weather:**

- Rain Florida peninsula; Northern Plains to Upper Mississippi Valley
- Critical/Elevated Fire Weather Areas MT, WY, SD, NE, KS, OK & TX
- Red Flag Warnings MT, WY, NE, KS, OK & TX
- Space weather: Past 24 hours none; next 24 hours minor, G1 geomagnetic storms predicted

# Flooding – Southeast (FINAL)



#### **Situation**:

River conditions continue to improve across the region

### **Impacts - South Carolina:**

- Fatalities: 19 confirmed storm related fatalities
- Shelters: 13 shelters open w/ 356 occupants
- Transportation: 224 (-1) road and 98 (-5) bridge closures statewide
  - o Most of I-95 open; a portion of the northbound lanes remain closed
- Most of the schools/government offices have returned to normal operations


SC EOC is Partially Activated

#### **FEMA Region IV:**

- RRCC at Level III (day shift); RWC at Enhanced Watch (night shift)
- JFO established in Blythewood, SC; Regional IMATs assisting as needed
- 10 DRCs open


#### FEMA HQ:

- NWC returned to Watch/Steady State (24/7); National IMATs East-1 & West are deployed to SC
- US&R: VA-TF2, VA-TF1 & IST Red have demobilized
- MERS Communication package & MCOVs remain deployed to SC
- Logistics: 30 DRC kits & 15 Accessibility kits deployed to SC




# 2 Day Tropical Outlook – Atlantic





# 2 Day Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific






#### Disturbance #1 (As of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located 625 miles SW of Manzanillo, Mexico
- Moving W at 10-15 mph
- Environmental conditions expected to become more conducive for development
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (10%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: High (80%)


### 2 Day Tropical Outlook – Central Pacific





# Central Pacific – Tropical Storm Nora






### <u>Tropical Storm Nora (Advisory #16 as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)</u>

- Located 595 miles SE of Hilo, HI
- Moving WNW at 10 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 45 mph
- Slow weaken expected over the next couple of days
- No coastal watched or warnings in effect

# Western Pacific – Tropical Depression 25W







### TD 25W (Advisory #1 as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located 1,100 miles E of Guam
- Moving WNW toward Mariana Islands at 13 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 30 mph
- Environmental conditions will be marginally favorable for development
- May become a tropical storm on Wednesday




# Precipitation Forecast, 1-3 Day






