

On August 5, 2015, the President signed a Major Disaster Declaration (**FEMA-4235-DR**) for the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands due to impacts associated with Typhoon Soudelor during the period of August 1-3, 2015. The declaration provides individual Assistance, Public Assistance, and Hazard Mitigation for CNMI.




FEMA-4240-DR-CA

On September 22, 2015, the President signed a Major Disaster Declaration (FEMA-4240-DR) for the State of California due to the Valley and Butte Fire that occurred September 12, 2015. The declaration provides Individual Assistance for Lake County. Calaveras and Lake Counties have been granted Emergency Protective Measures (Category B), limited to direct federal assistance and Public Assistance (Categories A-G), under the Public Assistance Program. All areas in the State of California are eligible for assistance under the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program.




TROPICAL WEATHER:

Tropical Storm OLAF (19E)




Location: About 1,595 miles west-southwest of the southern tip of Baja California,

Mexico.

Maximum Sustained Winds: 60 mph Present Movement: West at 13 mph

Forecast: OLAF is expected to continue generally westward with a decrease in forward speed followed by a turn to the west-northwest Sunday. Additional strengthening is forecast during the next 48 hours and OLAF could become a hurricane later tonight or Sunday morning.



Disturbance 1: A large area of disorganized cloudiness and thunderstorms, extending from Central America westward to several hundred miles south of southeastern Mexico, is associated with a broad area of low pressure. Environmental conditions are expected to be conducive for gradual development of this system, and a tropical depression is likely to form during the early or middle part of next week while the low moves west-northwestward or northwestward.


* Formation chance through 48 hours is low, 10 percent

WESTERN PACIFIC:

Typhoon CHAMPI (25W):



Location:

- About 325 miles northwest of Tinian, CNMI
- About 330 miles west-northwest of Saipan, CNMI
- About 345 miles northwest of Rota, CNMI
- About 360 miles northwest of Guam

Maximum Sustained Winds: 105 mph Present Movement: Northwest at 7 mph

Watches/Warnings: None.

Impacts: CNMI EOC stood down at 1700 ChST 17 Oct 2015 for this event.

Life and Safety: No injuries have been reported.

Utilities:

Power

- <u>Saipan</u> All primary feeders are energized; awaiting assessments on secondary distribution lines.
- <u>Tinian</u> Two primary feeders are online; 90% of power service should be restored tonight.
- Rota: Power on for entire island/normal operations

Water

• <u>Saipan</u>- <50% of wells have been brought back online; 12/15 water tanks have been brought back online.

- <u>Tinian</u>- The primary water line feeding approximately 2,200 residents in the Village of San Jose has ruptured in over 700 feet. Time of repair is approximately 3 days. Three water stations have been set up using fire hydrants to provide water.
- Rota- No reported issues

Communications- Telephone and Cellular are intermittent; ISP and Radio are normal

Health Care

- No patients have been admitted with storm-related injuries
- Kagman Health Clinic (outpatient) has been closed due to flooding


Shelter Summary:

- Saipan- Currently one open shelters with three residents.
- Tinian- The shelter has closed.

Transportation:

- CNMI seaports remain in Port Condition ZULU; no ship movement in or out.
- Saipan and Tinian Airports remain open with commercial flights resuming service.

REGIONAL SIGNIFICANT WEATHER: A low pressure system will continue to bring rain into the southwest impacting areas from Los Angeles to Las Vegas and through Arizona. Moderate to heavy rain will also be possible for areas of northern Nevada through the weekend. Thunderstorms in this system will trigger flash flooding with the possibility of mudslides and debris flows. Damaging winds will also be possible for some storms.




FLASH FLOOD WARNING

AZ/CA/NV: Showers and thunderstorms are expected through Sunday evening across the area. Area will see heavy rainfall at times which will potentially cause flash flooding, mudslides, or debris flows. This system will continue to push to the east impacting more of Arizona over the weekend.

Overall Fire Risk:

Most of the region will have a low to moderate risk of fire danger today.
