Legislation based on the Wisconsin Council on Forestry's Managed Forest Law (MFL) recommendations has been introduced and referred to the Wisconsin State Assembly Committee on Environment and Forestry. Wisconsin forestry practices study kicks off

Research study begins; results will guide future policy decisions.

A comprehensive study of Wisconsin DNR forestry practices began in January 2014. The Great Lakes Timber Professionals Association and the Wisconsin County Forests Association received a state grant for the two-year study. Results of the study will help guide decisions and policy development for investment in forest-based manufacturing, while ensuring that social and ecological benefits provided by Wisconsin's forests remain viable for future generations. The National Council for Air and Stream Improvement has been selected as general contractor for the study. Staff training focuses on industry, customer service

Division of Forestry personnel gathered in January for training that included sessions on Wisconsin's forest industry, designed to help staff better understand the challenges facing our partners. An opening session called "Understanding Wisconsin's Forest Products Supply Chain and the Partnerships that Make it Happen" was followed by three panels comprised of primary industry representatives, loggers and cooperating foresters. Urban forestry grants awarded

More than \$600,000 in grants will support urban forestry work.

The DNR Urban Forestry Grant Program has awarded \$602,486 to 46 Wisconsin communities, nonprofit organizations and counties for community urban forestry projects. Grant funds for 2014 projects will support tree inventories and assessments, management plans, emerald ash borer (EAB) preparedness plans, urban forest restoration projects, staff training, public education and other urban forestry efforts. "Friend of Forestry" awards to two external partners

Partners at UWSP and Aldo Leopold Foundation honored. The Division of Forestry recently honored two partners as Friends of Forestry. UW-Stevens Point Forestry Professor Mike Demchik has worked with DNR forestry programs in central Wisconsin for a number of years, conducting research on state-owned lands and bringing his silviculture students to state lands to work with DNR foresters for hands-on timber marking experience.

The Division also recognized the Aldo Leopold Foundation for their leadership in promoting sustainable forest management on private lands in Wisconsin and nationally. Executive Director Buddy Huffaker and his staff have partnered with DNR on a variety of programs, including the Driftless Forestry Network.

Urban forestry council recognizes excellence

Awards showcase outstanding urban forestry work throughout Wisconsin.

The Wisconsin Urban Forestry Council presented their lifetime achievement award to Todd Ernster for long-time service to the profession. Innovation awards went to the Mequon Nature Preserve and also to a partnership that processes and markets Milwaukee's urban wood. The City of Menasha and the Canadian National railroad received an award for their tree planting partnership, as did a coalition of groups whose work has resulted in a healthier and more diverse urban forest for the City of Sparta.
