WHO'S IT FOR? Carers and all staff at induction (including administrative staff, cooks, drivers and housekeeping staff).	WHO'S IT FOR? Carers and all staff directly supporting adults who may be at risk of abuse.	PROTECTION WHO'S IT FOR? Carers and all staff who work without direct supervision (e.g. domiciliary care workers), those with line management responsibility (e.g. team or shift leaders), those who make or take safeguarding referrals (e.g. G.P.s, Community Nurses, ART workers, CCT staff)	WHO'S IT FOR? Any staff who may be asked to contribute to a safeguarding investigation (e.g. care home managers & deputies, human resources staff, identified CCT workers, ward and community based nurses, ART team leaders).	WHO'S IT FOR? Statutory sector managers who are responsible for managing staff undertaking safeguarding investigations, chairing strategy meetings or working with providers to improve services (e.g. ACS Practice Managers & Cluster Managers, NHS Community Team Leaders/Managers, Clinical Leads, Modern Matrons, Managing Partners).
AIM: To provide basic awareness about abuse and how to report concerns.	AIM: To provide the knowledge needed to recognise, respond to and report abuse appropriately. It considers how you can promote the rights and autonomy of the people you support, duty of care and how you can work in partnership to enable people to live a life free from abuse and neglect.	AIM: To develop the skills and knowledge needed to reduce the likelihood of abuse and neglect occurring (through positive risk taking strategies, good mental capacity assessments and best interest decisions) and to develop the skills needed to respond appropriately where abuse may have occurred.	AIM: To provide the knowledge and skills needed to contribute to the planning and undertaking of a sound and effective Safeguarding Adults investigation, alone or in association with other agencies.	AIM: To provide the knowledge and skills needed to ensure the effective implementation of the multi-agency safeguarding adults' policy among your staff group.
