DeSoto State Park's Campfire Talk Series



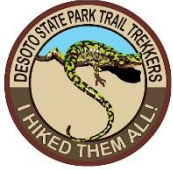

Pyrography or woodburning is the art of decorating wood or other materials, the term meaning “writing with fire” dating back to the 17th century. The designs for this class features beautiful stonework by the builders of DeSoto State Park, the Civilian Conservation Corps (late 1930s-early 1940s). This class is for ages 14 to adult.

In 1838, the Cherokee Nation -- with more than 16,000 men, women, and children -- was removed from their lands in the Southeastern United States to the Indian Territory (present-day Oklahoma) which resulted in the deaths of approximately 4,000 Cherokees. In the Cherokee language, the event is called Nunna daul Isunyi—"the Trail Where They Cried". Retired JSU professor Dr. Kelly Gregg will share the story of the Native American people before, during, and after this tragic chapter in our nation's history.

What to know: This trip is approximately 4 miles round trip on flatwater, spans a 3 to 3 1/2-hour period and includes kayak, paddle, & personal flotation device. Weight limits: 300 pounds for singles & 450 for tandems. Ages 8 to adult.

What to bring: Appropriate clothing for weather (you may get wet), headlamp or flashlight, bug spray, snacks, and drinking water.

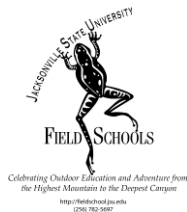
