30	(1) It is of the utmost importance that Arkansas youth learn the			
31	importance of the national anthem, "The Star-Spangled Banner";			
32	(2) The regular playing of "The Star-Spangled Banner" will			
33	foster patriotism and celebrate the common American experience; and			
34	(3) "The Star-Spangled Banner" should be played in solemn			
35	observance and recognition for the men and women who have sacrificed their			
36	lives in defense of the American Experiment.			

1	(c) Each state-supported institution of higher education shall:		
2	(1)(A) Adopt a policy requiring the broadcast of "The Star-		
3	Spangled Banner" at the commencement of each school-sanctioned sporting		
4	event.		
5	(B) However, if any part of two (2) or more school-		
6	sanctioned sporting events occur on the same day at the same school, a state-		
7	supported institution of higher education may choose to broadcast "The Star-		
8	Spangled Banner" at only one (1) of the events; and		
9	(2) Except as provided in subsection (d) of this section, selec-		
10	for broadcast from any recording of "The Star-Spangled Banner" that adheres		
11	to rules promulgated by the Division of Higher Education.		
12	(d) A state-supported institution of higher education may adopt a		
13	policy that allows any of the following to be played at school-sanctioned		
14	sporting events, at schools during school hours, or both:		
15	(1) The performance of "The Star-Spangled Banner" from original		
16	sheet music that adheres to division rules and is performed by a school-		
17	sanctioned band program;		
18	(2) The performance of "The Star-Spangled Banner" from original		
19	sheet music that adheres to division rules and is performed by a school-		
20	sanctioned chorale program, vocal group, or vocalist; or		
21	(3) The performance of "The Star-Spangled Banner" by the		
22	attendees of a school-sanctioned event led by a vocalist selected by the		
23	state-supported institution of higher education hosting the school-sanctioned		
24	event.		
25	(e) The division shall promulgate rules to implement this section.

27	SECTION 3. DO NOT CODIFY. Rules.		
28	(a) When adopting the initial rules required under this act, the		
29	Division of Elementary and Secondary Education shall file the final rules		
30	with the Secretary of State for adoption under § 25-15-204(f):		
31	(1) On or before January 1, 2022; or		
32	(2) If approval under § 10-3-309 has not occurred by January 1,		
33	2022, as soon as practicable after approval under § 10-3-309.		
34	(b) The division shall file the proposed rules with the Legislative		
35	Council under § 10-3-309(c) sufficiently in advance of January 1, 2022, so		
36	that the Legislative Council may consider the rules for approval before		

1	January 1, 2022.

9	2022, as soon as practicable after approval under § 10-3-309.			
10	(b) The division shall file the proposed rules with the Legislative			
11	Council under § 10-3-309(c) sufficiently in advance of January 1, 2022, so
