Daisy Mountain Fire & Medical Smoke Alarm Program

Interested in learning more about how to prepare your home and family against a home fire?

Sign up for a home fire safety visit, including FREE smoke alarm(s) and installation for your household.

About the Smoke Alarms:

- Non-Hardwired Smoke alarms with 10-year concealed battery
- Included: Mounting bracket, 2 wall screws, 2 anchors and maintenance guide
- No battery replacement
- Replace entire unit every 10 years

1st - Identify and Install Smoke Alarms:

Fire department installation program guidelines, new, or replacement install:

- Identifies non-working out of date smoke alarms and install Non-Hardwired Smoke Alarms with 10-year concealed battery
- Included: Mounting bracket, 2 wall screws, 2 anchors and maintenance guide
- No battery replacement
- In and Outside every sleeping area.
- On every level of the home (including basement).
- Installed on the ceiling or wall.
- Not within 3 feet of windows, doors, vents, ceiling fans, or bathrooms.
- Not within 15 feet of cooking appliances.
- Use wall screws to mount brackets to wall or ceiling
- Place alarm on bracket and twist clockwise (alarm will sound).

The fire district will provide at **NO COST** to vulnerable residents in low-income and high-risk neighborhoods a home safety educational visit and provide free smoke alarm and installation for your household.

2nd - Educate Residents On Fire Safety:

- Demonstrate how to test the alarm (Residents should test monthly).
- Provide the resident with the Smoke Alarms & Home Safety Information.
- Review the Resident's Home Fire Safety Checklist and Fire Escape Plan



Safety Tips

- ★ Never allow children to play with or ignite fireworks, including sparklers.
- ★ Make sure fireworks are legal in your area before buying or using them.
- ★ Keep a bucket of water or a garden hose handy in case of fire or other mishap.
- ★ Light fireworks one at a time, then move back quickly.
- ★ Never try to re-light or pick up fireworks that have not ignited fully.
- ★ Never use fireworks while impaired by alcohol or drugs.

How to make a Home Fire Escape Plan





- Draw a map of your home. Show all doors and windows.
- Visit each room. Find two ways out.
- All windows and doors should open easily. You should be able to use them to get outside.
- Make sure your home has smoke alarms. Push the test button to make sure each alarm is working.
- Pick a meeting place outside. It should be in front of your home. Everyone will meet at the meeting place.
- Make sure your house or building number can be seen from the street.
- Talk about your plan with everyone in your home.
- Learn the emergency phone number for your fire department.
- Practice your home fire drill!
- Make your own home fire escape plan using the grid provided on page 2.

Sample Escape Plan



6 FIRE SAFETY TIPS FOR PETS



Keep away from stoves and countertops.

Have a 3 foot "pet free" zone away from fireplaces.

Keep pets away from candles, lamps, and space heaters.

Have working smoke alarms on every level and test them once a month.

Consider using flameless candles.

Never go back inside for pets in a fire. Tell a firefighter.
