School Year 2026-2027

Yavapai CattleWomen and Yavapai Cattle Growers are offering scholarships to deserving graduating seniors or to continuing college students who will be carrying 12 or more credit hours per semester. Both groups work together for the promotion of the beef industry. Scholarships are based on points given for the following:

Student application must qualify for **ONE** or more of the following items:

1. Applicants must be a resident of Yavapai County.
2. Applicants are either a son, daughter or relative of a current member of the Yavapai CattleWomen or Yavapai Cattle Growers.
3. Applicant's major is in the agricultural field.
4. Students may receive this scholarship only two times.
5. Applicant's parent/guardian or student's livelihood is derived in part with cattle or agricultural industry.
6. Other applicants will be considered.

Submit a current official copy of all high school and/or college transcripts, from the fall semester. Include your rank and number of students in your graduation class. This form must be completed and mailed together with your application.

Student application forms are to be completed by applicant either typed or neatly printed in ink. Applications from the YavapacowbelleS.org website must be printed off and included with the other forms listed and postmarked by April 30, 2026.

Student applicants shall submit a dated letter of intent, preferably typed with all agricultural activities, classes, work in the field of your family or others, FFA and 4-H experience, future plan and goals that include work in the agricultural field. Let us know how many of your family, if anyone, other siblings will be in college and of the financial needs of your family. If you plan to work this summer, during school, we would like to know about your work experience and how many hours per week. If part of your or your family's income is related to the agricultural industry, please explain. This letter is one of the very best ways the committee gets to know you. Please write a detailed letter.

Applicants must submit two (2) current dated letters of recommendation from teachers or persons other than relatives.

The applicant is to supply a current photo, suitable for publication. Photo cannot be returned.

Applications must be postmarked by April 30, 2026.

The scholarship shall be for any college, university, or vocational school. It shall be good only for the year issued. The scholarship will be divided between the 2 school semesters and sent out to the student upon receipt of proof of enrollment. This must be mailed to the treasurer; address will be provided in the acceptance letter. Exceptions shall be made for vocational schools.

New Year's Resolution – Clean up the brush on your property? Worried about FIRE? DO YOU HAVE A LOAD OF BRUSH IN YOUR BACK YARD? FREE MONEY!!!!

Every year Dewey-Humboldt Firewise (DHFV) offers town residents grants to help clear their brush. Each year the grants have different requirements. For 2026 we have grants available as the following:

- **Minimum 1 acre required for mitigation**
- **\$2862 is total grant for each acre,**
 - **You must pay whole invoice amount to contractor for work completed (this can be more than the grant money)**
 - **Your share of grant that you must pay is \$858.60 per acre (30% of total grant)**
 - **You will be reimbursed (after several months) up to a total of \$2003.40 per acre (or 30% of cost up to maximum grant)**
- **Property must be within town boundary of Dewey-Humboldt**
- **Grant money cannot be used to clear property for future structure building**
- **Grant requires property assessment by DHFV and follow Firewise process.**

Once approved, you will be placed on a wait-list until the current grant has been completed.

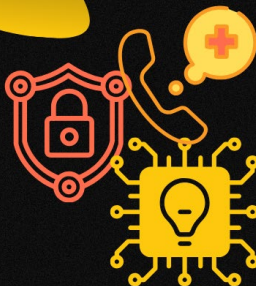

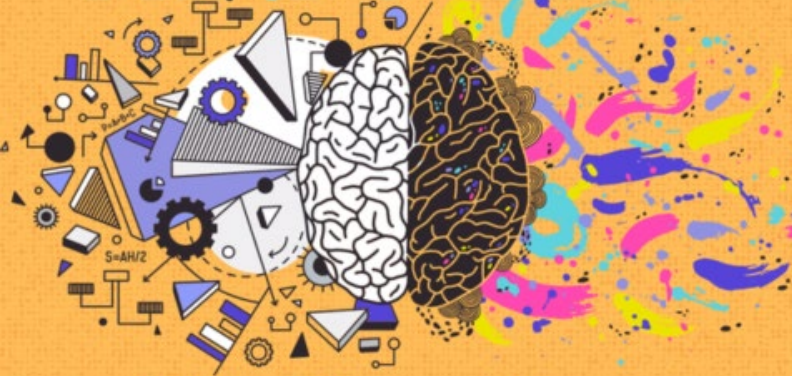
