Create a Family Communication Plan

Identify an out-of-area contact, establish a meeting location, and make sure every household member knows what to do if separated during an emergency.

Sign up for Emergency Alerts

Residents can register for emergency notifications through their local alert system to receive real-time warnings for their area by visiting smrt91.com.



Program Important Numbers

Store emergency contacts in your phone and write them down in case your device is lost or inoperable.

Invest in a NOAA Weather Radio

Battery-powered or hand-crank NOAA radios provide alerts even when cell towers and internet are down.



Consider Amateur (Ham) Radio

Amateur radio operators play a vital role in emergency communications. Contact your local amateur radio club to learn more about getting licensed.

ONLINE ROMANCE SCAM



It can begin with innocent contact on social media, a text message, or an online dating site

It usually starts out with the "love interest" telling you how much they have in common with you



They will attempt to gain information about you so they can assess your financial standing (job history, retirement, property, etc)

With A.I., they can create a fake bio of themselves to impress you, complete with photos and videos



At some point, they will ask for money for an urgent need (family, medical, legal) and promise to pay you back



NEVER send money by any method (crypto, gift cards, cash apps, etc) to someone you have never met in person face-to-face

5 RULES TO AVOID SCAMS



Do not answer any unsolicited contact (phone call, text, email, popup, social media)



Do not click on any links or attachments in such texts or emails



Do not call any phone numbers they provide (look up the true contact info on your own)



Do not send money by any method (crypto ATM, gift cards, cash apps, wire transfer) to people you have not verified



Do not let fear make you act immediately (take your time, verify everything)

Scammers depend on you acting on the information they provide. They don't want you to verify anything and they want you to act now! DON'T DO IT!!!
