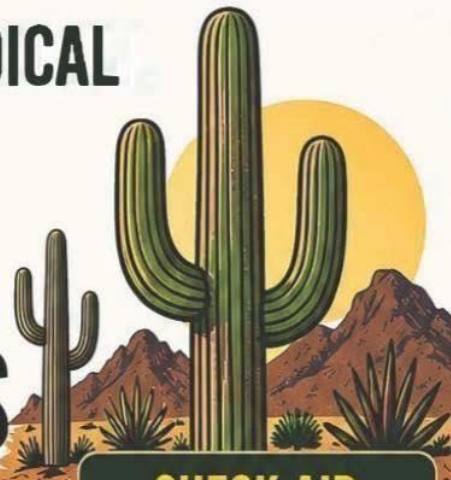

# FIRE RESTRICTIONS



**MAY 1 THROUGH SEPT 30 ANNUALLY**

**CHECK AIR  
QUALITY WEBSITE  
BEFORE YOU BURN**

To help prevent wildfires and protect our communities, Stage 1 Fire Restrictions are now in effect for Daisy Mountain Fire & Medical.

## WHAT IS RESTRICTED?

During Stage 1 Fire Restrictions, the following activities are **prohibited** unless otherwise noted:



Building, maintaining or using an open fire, campfire



Fireworks, including firecrackers



Sky lanterns



Tiki and similar kinds of torches



Operating a solid fuel burning appliance

## EXCEPTIONS – THE FOLLOWING ACTIVITIES ARE **ALLOWED**:



- The use of portable gas or propane fireplaces and camp stoves
- The use of briquettes in a barbecue



Cooking fires on residential properties and developed park facilities with grills & fire rings provided by the property owners/HOA. Fires shall be contained within the provided burning appliance or 3 feet x 3 feet; whichever is smaller.



**ANY OPEN FLAME REQUIRES** a responsible person be in attendance at all times, capable of calling 9-1-1, with an immediate means to extinguish the fire.

### READY

Be Prepared.

Sign up for local alerts.

Create and practice an emergency plan.



### SET

Be Alert.

Prepare to evacuate.

Evacuate early If you need extra time or feel your life Is In danger.



### GO!

Evacuate Now.

Do not hesitate.

Bring your pets and emergency kit.



# **RATTLESNAKE SAFETY TIPS**



## **IF BITTEN DO:**

- CALL 911 IMMEDIATELY**
- REMOVE RINGS, WATCHES, ETC WHICH MAY CONSTRICT SWELLING**
- SIT OR LIE DOWN SO BITE IS IN NEUTRAL, COMFORTABLE POSITION**
- IMMOBILIZE THE AFFECTED AREA**
- REMAIN CALM**

## **IF BITTEN DO NOT PERFORM THE FOLLOWING:**

- TOURNIQUET OR CONSTRICTING BANDS**
- INCISION AND/OR SUCTION**
- APPLICATION OF COLD PACKS/ICE**

- ALWAYS WATCH WHERE YOU STEP**
- STICK TO TRAILS**
- AVOID TALL GRASS/BRUSH**
- AVOID UNDER BRUSH WHERE SNAKES MAY SHELTER**
- BE ALERT WHEN BIKING/WALKING**
- KEEP PETS ON A LEASH**
- KEEP YOUR DISTANCE**
- IF YOU HEAR A RATTLING NOISE, DO NOT APPROACH**

# **DON'T SPARK A FIRE**

- Dragging chains during towing can cause sparks. Check and secure tow chains, and never substitute parts when towing.
- Check tire pressure before you travel. Exposed wheel rims can cause sparks.
- Don't park in tall grass or dry brush. The heat from parts under your vehicle can ignite a fire.
- Don't toss lit cigarettes out the window.



## Daisy Mountain Fire & Medical Smoke Alarm Program

Interested in learning more about how to prepare your home and family against a home fire?  
Sign up for a home fire safety visit, including **FREE** smoke alarm(s) and installation for your household.

### About the Smoke Alarms:

- Non-Hardwired Smoke alarms with 10-year concealed battery
- Included: Mounting bracket, 2 wall screws, 2 anchors and maintenance guide
- No battery replacement
- Replace entire unit every 10 years

### **1st - Identify and Install Smoke Alarms:**

Fire department installation program guidelines, new, or replacement install:

- Identifies non-working out of date smoke alarms and install Non-Hardwired Smoke Alarms with 10-year concealed battery
- Included: Mounting bracket, 2 wall screws, 2 anchors and maintenance guide
- No battery replacement
- In and Outside every sleeping area.
- On every level of the home (including basement).
- Installed on the ceiling or wall.
- Not within 3 feet of windows, doors, vents, ceiling fans, or bathrooms.
- Not within 15 feet of cooking appliances.
- Use wall screws to mount brackets to wall or ceiling
- Place alarm on bracket and twist clockwise (alarm will sound).

The fire district will provide at **NO COST** to vulnerable residents in low-income and high-risk neighborhoods a home safety educational visit and provide free smoke alarm and installation for your household.

### **2nd - Educate Residents On Fire Safety:**

- Demonstrate how to test the alarm (Residents should test monthly).
- Provide the resident with the Smoke Alarms & Home Safety Information.
- Review the Resident's Home Fire Safety Checklist and Fire Escape Plan

### **Free Education to Help Your Family Prepare for Home Fire**

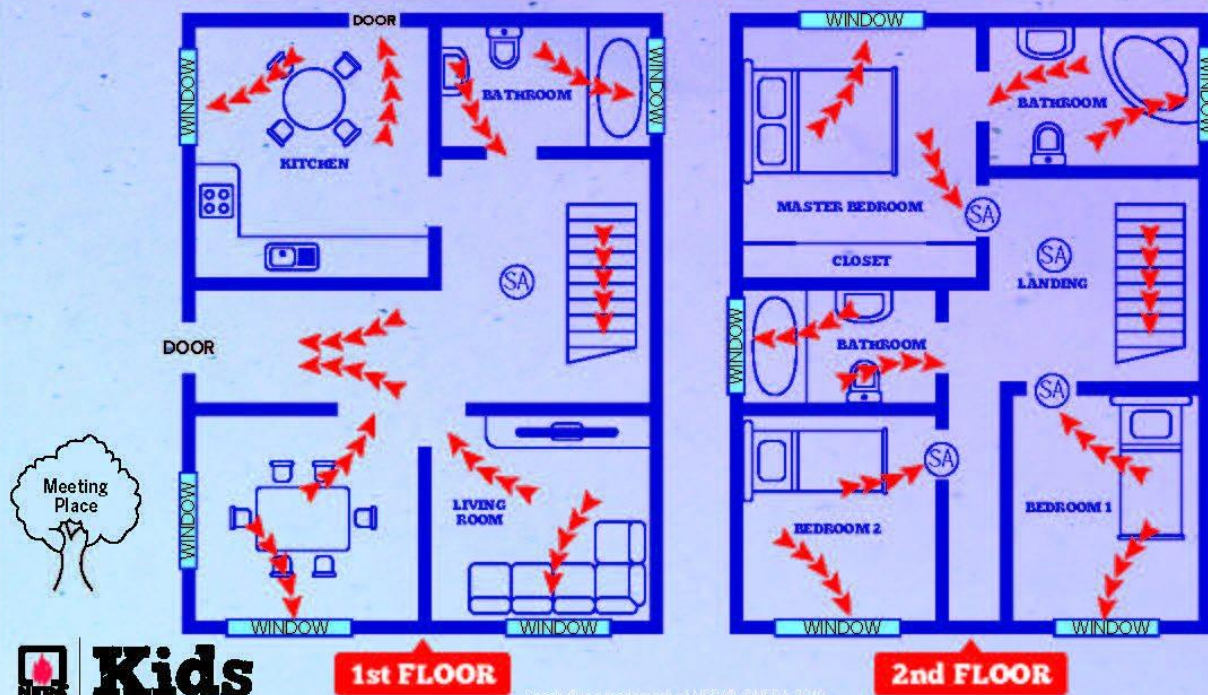

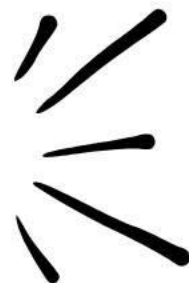
- ☐ Draw a map of your home. Show all doors and windows.
- ☐ Visit each room. Find two ways out.
- ☐ All windows and doors should open easily. You should be able to use them to get outside.
- ☐ Make sure your home has smoke alarms. Push the test button to make sure each alarm is working.
- ☐ Pick a meeting place outside. It should be in front of your home. Everyone will meet at the meeting place.
- ☐ Make sure your house or building number can be seen from the street.
- ☐ Talk about your plan with everyone in your home.
- ☐ Learn the emergency phone number for your fire department.
- ☐ Practice your home fire drill!
- ☐ Make your own home fire escape plan using the grid provided on page 2.

# 6 FIRE SAFETY TIPS FOR PETS



Keep away from stoves  
and countertops.

Have a 3 foot "pet free"  
zone away from  
fireplaces.

Keep pets away from  
candles, lamps, and  
space heaters.

Have working smoke  
alarms on every level  
and test them once a  
month.

Consider using  
flameless candles.

Never go back inside  
for pets in a fire. Tell a  
firefighter.
