The Nation will be paying for (1) round trip for an enrolled Tribal Member under a **first come first serve basis**. **Must present Tribal ID at landing pad. No flights on Saturdays.**

- ALL members will be required to pay for their bag and cargo fees, each fee is for **one way, no round trips**.
 - Bag Fee (35lb limit)- \$5.00, every 5lb over is \$1.00 extra
 - Cargo Sling Fee (400 lb limit) -\$150.00 (each way=\$300.00 total)

Respecting Community Mailboxes

Damage to the postal cubicles has recently been reported. Specifically, the keys to the parcel compartments used for larger package deliveries were found bent and damaged due to being kicked.

Please be advised that tampering with or damaging mailboxes, parcel lockers, or postal keys is considered a federal offense under the United States Postal Service regulations and federal law. Individuals found responsible for damaging postal property may be subject to fines, criminal charges, and liability for repair or replacement.

Continued damage to the mailboxes and parcel lockers may result in the large packages no longer being delivered to the community mailboxes. If this occurs again, residents will be required to pick up oversized packages directly from the post office.

We ask all residents to use the mail facilities respectfully and to report any issues or suspicious activity to the authorities.

Lock-out Charges Now Being Enforced

To help ensure staff availability for emergency maintenance needs and after-hours calls, all lock-out service charges will now be strictly enforced and assessed to tenant accounts effective immediately.

If a resident is locked out of their unit and requests assistance from management or maintenance staff, a lock-out fee of **\$30** will be charged regardless of the time of day the service is provided. This includes after-hours, weekends, and holidays.

Residents are encouraged to:

- Always carry their keys
- Double-check for keys before leaving home
- Provide a spare key to a trusted family member or friend if desired

Please remember that repeated lock-out calls place a strain on emergency resources that are intended for urgent maintenance situations.

We appreciate everyone's cooperation and understanding as we continue working to provide timely services to all tenants.

To all fathers and father figures in our community, Thank you for your dedication, sacrifices, humor, patience, and unconditional love.

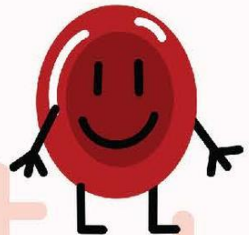

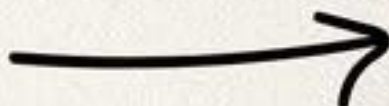

Diabetes Program will provide funding for the following medical supplies for Native Americans diagnosed with Diabetes. Limited funding is available.

Diabetes shoes requires physician referral

Eyeglasses are funded up to \$250 for basic frames and lenses, voucher is also required and must be presented at the time of eye appointment, service is available for all Native American, while funding is available. Services provided for glasses in the prior year will not be eligible for assistance.

Medical Equipment provided - Bath bench, Walkers, Wheelchairs, Diabetes shoes and socks, Blood pressure monitor's and eyeglasses just to name a few. No motorized equipment can be rented or purchased.
