ROLL CALL – Meeting was called to order at 6:03pm by Chairman Pesses. Smart, Hillendahl, Patterson and Stirling were also present. Samaniego-Taylor and Whitaker were absent.

FLAG SALUTE - Patterson led the flag salute.

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- 1. Kris Payne brought up the need for an evacuation route out of Deer Park. There is now only one way in and one way out.
- 2. Carl Hillendahl introduced a gentleman who might want to join the Committee.

CORRESPONDENCE: None

REPORTS:

- 1. Gina Hamilton from the Planning Department gave a report on the Slate Creek Animal Hospital expansion and remodel project. Dr. Christina Vos and Paul Vos answered any questions the Committee had. Randy pointed out that there needs to be sufficient turning radius for horse trailers to turn around and proper driveway signage. After discussion by members of the Committee and input from the public, it was decided that Ranndy will draft a letter with those recommendations and we will reserve availability for the Vos's to speak to us again if they wish.
- 2. Gina also introduced Blake Popejoy, a local real estate agent who was born and raised here. He spoke regarding his project, the construction of a 12 unit apartment building on Panther Lane, close to Fowler Lane in Diamond Springs. Randy objects to a 3 story building; not a good blending of land use. However, affordable housing is desperately needed. It was agreed that this location would need to have an alternate traffic route. Three stories can look like a box or can be very nice, with landscaping. Good looking properties attract renters.

COMMITTEE REPORTS: Kris Payne reported that the Diamond Springs Parkway project is moving along and the Old Depot Road/Missouri Flat Road bike park and Senior park are still in the works. Matt Smeltzer (Planning Department) acquired a 5 million dollar grant from Cal Trans, for the D.S. Parkway.
