#### **SITUATION**

### **Current Situation:**

No operations that may cause loud noise and/or vibrations are planned for the well at 4360 Via Marina over the weekend, though crews will remain at the site.

Daily monitoring indicates that well operations are not affecting air quality.

The Los Angeles County Department of Public Health, Los Angeles County Fire Department-Health Hazardous Materials Division, and the California Division of Oil, Gas, and Geothermal Resources continue to monitor the situation.

If you smell gas in this vicinity, please leave the area and dial 9-1-1.

A gas odor reported midday Friday, March 15, was unrelated to the well re-abandonment project. Firefighters from Los Angeles County Fire Station 110 responded to the Marina del Rey Sheriff's Station at 11:54 a.m. after receiving reports from Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department personnel and members of the public about the smell of gas or sewage. No leak was detected, and based on prevailing winds to the north, fire crews believed the odor was coming from south of the Marina.

Southern California Gas (SoCalGas) crews responded and determined that the smell is not coming from a gas line or facility. According to SoCalGas, the company received reports of the odor from as far south as El Segundo. SoCalGas believes that the smell is sanitation-related.
