

**PROCLAMATION OF EXISTENCE OF A LOCAL EMERGENCY BY THE CHAIR OF THE LOS ANGELES COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS AND REQUEST FOR A STATE PROCLAMATION**

**WHEREAS**, Chapter 2.68 of the Los Angeles County Code provides that the Chair of the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors (Board) may proclaim the existence of a local emergency when the County of Los Angeles (County) is affected or likely to be affected by a public calamity and the Board is not in session; and

**WHEREAS**, the Chair of the Board finds that beginning on October 28, 2019, conditions of disaster and extreme peril to the safety of persons and property arose as a result of countywide extreme fire weather conditions, public safety power shutoffs, and multiple fires including the Getty Fire that began in the City of Los Angeles; and the Oak Fire in the City of Calabasas, which has created conditions that are beyond the control of local resources; and

**WHEREAS**, the Getty Fire has burned over 600 acres, leading to wide spread evacuations of residents, necessitating multiple human and pet sheltering operations. The Getty Fire poses a threat to residential areas, businesses and critical infrastructure in the area and has caused the closure of multiple schools and intermittent freeway and highway closures. In order to combat the Getty Fire and Oak Fire, there has been a need for mutual aid assistance; and


**WHEREAS**, these conditions warrant and necessitate that the County proclaim the existence of a local emergency.

**NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY PROCLAIMED AND ORDERED** by the Chair of the Board that a local emergency exists in Los Angeles County, and that if the Board does not take action to ratify this emergency proclamation within seven days of its issuance, it shall have no further force or effect; and

**IT IS FURTHER ORDERED AND PROCLAIMED** that during the existence of said local emergency the powers, functions, and duties of the emergency organization of the County shall be those prescribed by state law, by ordinances, and resolutions of the County; and

**IT IS FURTHER ORDERED AND PROCLAIMED** that a copy of this proclamation be forwarded to the Director of California Governor's Office of Emergency Services requesting that the Director find it acceptable in accordance with State law; that the Governor of California, pursuant to the Emergency Services Act, issue a proclamation declaring an emergency in Los Angeles County; that the Governor waive regulations that may hinder response and recovery efforts; that recovery assistance be made available under the California Disaster Assistance Act; and that the State expedite access to State and Federal resources and any other appropriate federal disaster relief programs.
