<p>COVID-19 TESTING</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Testing is Prioritized and Strongly Encouraged for:</p> <p>Symptomatic persons with:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Fever or chills, Cough, Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, Fatigue, Muscle or body aches, Headache, New loss of taste or smell, Sore throat, Congestion or runny nose, Nausea or vomiting, and Diarrhea. <p>Symptomatic persons who are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Hospitalized • Healthcare workers and other first responders • Employees and residents in group living settings, and • Over 65 years old or with <u>underlying health conditions</u> that place them at higher risk of serious complications <p>Asymptomatic persons:</p>

- If they are part of a public health investigation
- If they live or work in high risk settings, such as skilled nursing facilities or homeless shelters
- If they are a close contact of someone with a confirmed positive diagnosis of COVID-19, or
- If they are an essential worker.

Prioritization of routine testing among other asymptomatic people is not recommended at this time. People over the age of 65 or with underlying conditions do not necessarily need to be tested unless they have symptoms, have had an exposure or have been told by public health to be tested. Once again, please check with your healthcare provider about your specific situation and let their medical advice guide you.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • As of 9/30/20, Access Services has completed over 252,993 meal and grocery deliveries to seniors and people with disabilities across four current projects. • This week, #LetsFeedLACounty is hosting 3 drive-thru food distribution events 9/29 Pacoima, 9/30 El Monte and 10/1 Arcadia/Monrovia. • Total distributed to date at 36 events is 2,252 tons of food which is the equivalent 3.8 million meals provided to 64,864 households. • Drive-thru food distribution event held last week at Lennox Middle School, San Frnando Outdoor Swap Meet and Montebello Mall where: 1,233; 2,071; and 1,622 households, respectively, were provided 80 pounds of food, including shelf-stable items, dairy product frozen meat, and fresh produce. • Will have expanded to 3 distributions per week starting last week. • #LetsFeedLACounty has secured 400 20-pound boxes of groceries from the LA Regional Food Bank for weekly delivery through the end of December to clients of the DHS Housing for Health program. • Issuing additional CalFresh benefits up to the maximum allowed per family and allowing CalFresh recipients to purchase groceries online for delivery from Walmart and Amazon. • Great Plates Delivered has a current service population: 6,426 seniors. Total meals served through this program since May 12: 1,285,488. • The Great Plates Delivered Program has contracted with 67 meal providers that are employing 1,263 people. 61% of meal providers are minority-owned businesses. • Great Plates Program has been extended until October 9, 2020. • Elder Nutrition Program has a current service current population of 26,919 seniors (37% increase since June 20).
