Please join Marin County Supervisor Kate Sears and Marin County Department of Public Works staff for a ribbon cutting ceremony celebrating the Seminary Drive Stormwater Pump Station—the latest improvement to flood control in the Mill Valley area. All are welcome to join us as we celebrate this new pump station, which will help address a longstanding

street flooding problem. Flooding at this location along Redwood Highway Frontage Rd. at the Northbound Highway 101 and Seminary Dr. interchange would occur during high tides. This new pump station is a welcome improvement for drivers trying to access nearby businesses as well as for commuters using the bus pad and park-and-ride.

JMB Construction, Inc. completed construction of the \$400,000 station this April. Local development mitigation fees and Flood Control Zone No. 3 funds helped pay for construction, with the De Silva Island Homeowners Association donating the easement for the pump station.

PARKING Parking is very limited. Please consider ridesharing as an alternative to driving solo. A small number of side-by-side spaces are available in the parking lot at De Silva Island Ct. Additional parallel parking is available along Redwood Highway Frontage Rd. just south of the intersection with De Silva Island Ct.
