

Country Acres Clean Power Project Project Update September 2024




Overview


The Country Acres Clean Power Project is a joint venture between the Sacramento Municipal Utility District (SMUD) and Clēnera. Clēnera is headquartered in Boise, Idaho and has been developing solar power and battery storage projects for over a decade.

The project is located on approximately 1100 acres in Placer County, west of Roseville. The project will build 344 megawatt alternating current of solar photovoltaic arrays and 172 megawatt battery storage. McCarthy Building Companies, Inc. and Dashiell Corp. are providing engineering, procurement and construction (EPC) services for the project

Upcoming Milestones, Events, or Impacts

Baseline Road Improvements

Construction of a left turn lane on eastbound Baseline Road into the project location will begin in October. Speed limits will be reduced through the construction zone. Traffic will maintain a single travel lane in each direction for much of the time, however there will be periods the road will be restricted to a single lane, controlled by flaggers. Work is expected to last ten to fourteen weeks. Construction of this turn lane will accommodate the additional traffic needed for the construction of the solar and battery storage project, preserving safety and traffic flow.
