West Placer MAC – Term of February 2025-January 2027

About

Established in 1978 by the Board of Supervisors, MACs serve as a forum for community concerns, focusing on topics like land use and transportation. There are 13 MACs in the county, with 81 volunteer member seats available. Members are nominated by the Board member representing the district and appointed by a majority of the Board of Supervisors.

Purpose

The Municipal Advisory Council may advise the Board of Supervisors on matters that relate to the area served by the Municipal Advisory Council (MAC). The Council shall advise the Board of Supervisors on matters specifically referred to by the Board of Supervisors for review and recommendation.

Municipal Advisory Councils (MACs) are comprised of local residents who advise the Board of Supervisors on issues or concerns. MACs are designed to provide a local public forum where information about land use, transportation and general county information is shared and discussed. Residents are welcome and encouraged to attend MAC meetings to talk about issues that are important to them.

Requirements

Members shall, at the time of appointment, and at all times during term of office, be residents, property owners of real property, or business owners or managers operating a business within the Municipal Advisory Council (MAC) Boundaries. Failure to maintain such status shall result in a vacancy in office.


Preferred Qualities

Members should be familiar with the Brown Act, conflict of interest laws, parliamentary procedures, and effective public meeting management and etiquette. Members are expected to confirm their knowledge of these topics or participate in relevant training. Understanding local area dynamics, development standards, land use regulations, private property rights, and zoning laws is also beneficial.

The ideal candidate is respectful and considerate, offering constructive and civil input on discussed issues. Additionally, they should review the calendar for the West Placer MAC and be available for scheduled meetings on the third Wednesday of each month at 6:30 p.m. Meetings can be cancelled and special meetings can be scheduled.

Interested residents should fill out the Placer County Committee Application and submit it to the Clerk of the Board no later than Tuesday, December 3, 2024 at 5 p.m. Email the application to BoardClerk@placer.ca.gov. Members will be seated at the February 2025 MAC meeting.
