EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

A total of 3,718 adults and children were counted as experiencing homelessness during the 2026 Point-In-Time Count (PITC) and Survey. This represents a decrease of 119 persons (-3.1%) compared to the 2025 PITC, in which 3,837 persons were recorded.

A comparison of the 2025 and 2026 counts shows:

- 119 fewer persons were counted in 2026 (-3.1%);
- 188 fewer unsheltered persons were counted in 2026 compared to 2025, (-7.1%); and
- 69 more sheltered persons were counted in 2026 compared to 2025 (+5.7%).

HUD Definitions

Sheltered Homelessness

HUD requires Continuums of Care (CoCs) to count all individuals or families who meet the criteria in **24 CFR 578.3, paragraph (1)(ii)**, including those:

- “living in a supervised publicly or privately operated shelter designated to provide temporary living arrangements (including congregate shelters, transitional housing, and hotels and motels paid for by charitable organizations or by federal, state, or local government programs for low income individuals)” on the night designated for the count
- and individuals residing in Safe Haven projects.

Unsheltered Homelessness

HUD requires CoCs to count individuals or families who meet the criteria in 24 CFR 578.3, paragraph (1)(i), including those:

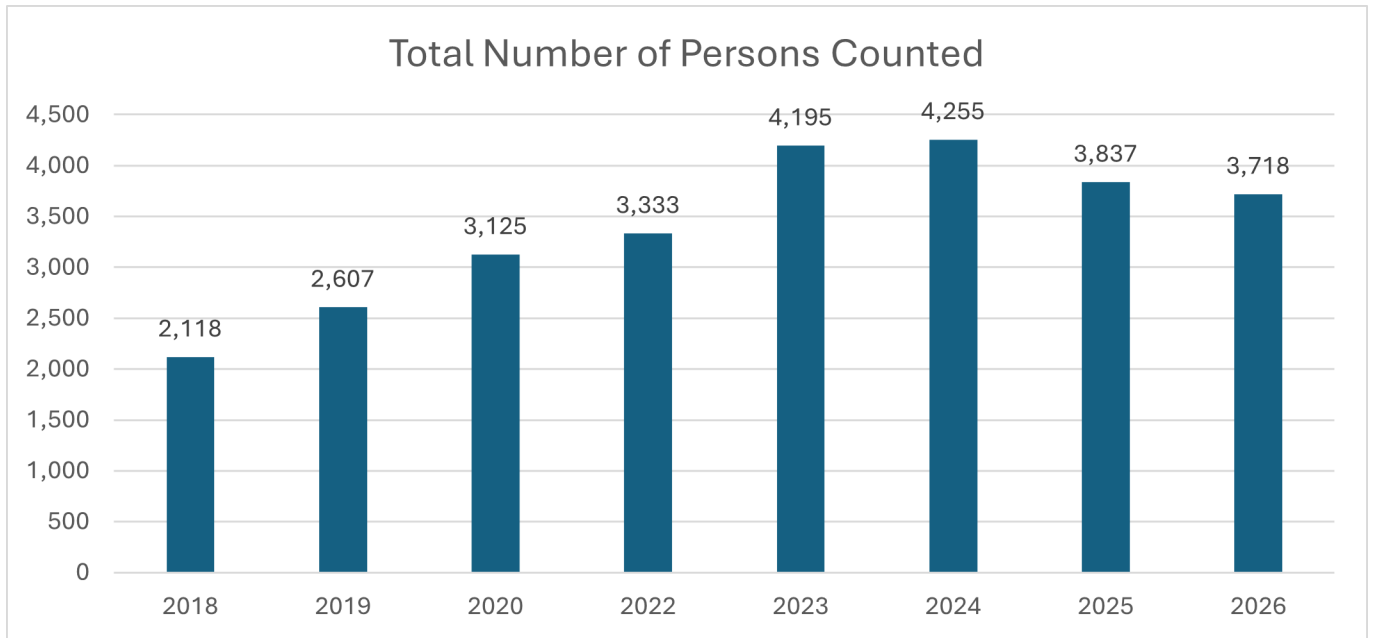
- “with a primary nighttime residence that is a public or private place not designed for or ordinarily used as a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings, including a car, park, abandoned building, bus or train station, airport, or camping ground.”

Households assisted through Rapid ReHousing (RRH) that remain unsheltered on the night of the count (e.g., living in an encampment while receiving RRH services) **must be included** in the unsheltered count.

HUD defines the “**night of the count**” as a single period from sunset to sunrise, spanning two consecutive calendar dates.

The following chart shows that the total number of people counted as homeless increased from **2,118 in 2018** to **3,718 in 2026**, an increase of **1,600 persons (75.5%)**. Each year following 2018 showed growth until 2025, when the count began to decline.

The 2026 count is **537 persons (12.6%)** lower than the 2024 total.



The following table provides a breakdown of sheltered and unsheltered persons counted by jurisdiction. Among the 1,270 sheltered persons, including 930 in emergency shelter and 340 in transitional housing:

- **924 were adults age 18+**
- **346 were children under age 18**

Among the **2,448 unsheltered persons**:

- **2,433 were adults age 18+**
- **15 were children under age 18**

There were **8 unsheltered families**, consisting of **11 adults and 15 children**, counted in the following locations:

- **San Bernardino City:** 4 families (5 adults, 7 children)
- **Ontario:** 2 families (3 adults, 3 children)
- **Rialto:** 1 family (2 adults, 4 children)
- **Unincorporated Area outside San Bernardino City:** 1 family (1 adult, 1 child)

Table 3 shows that 2,955 individuals (79.5%) of the 3,718 homeless adults and children counted in 2026 were located within eight jurisdictions:

Barstow, Colton, Fontana, Ontario, Rancho Cucamonga, Redlands, San Bernardino, and Victorville.

These eight jurisdictions accounted for:

- **1,911 unsheltered individuals**, or **78.1%** of the total unsheltered population of 2,448 countywide;
- **879 sheltered individuals**, or **94.5%** of the 930 persons counted in emergency shelters; and
- **245 individuals** in transitional housing, representing **72.1%** of the 340 persons counted in transitional housing programs.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), as part of its requirements for local Continuums of Care (CoCs) to continue receiving continuum of care funding for homeless services, requires CoCs to conduct a **one-day PITC** of sheltered and unsheltered homeless persons during the **last 10 days of January**. The **CA-609 San Bernardino City and County CoC** is one of nearly 400 jurisdictions nationwide that submit an annual application to HUD for continuum of care funding.

HUD requires CoCs to conduct a sheltered count every year and an unsheltered count every other year. However, the San Bernardino City and County CoC conducts an annual unsheltered count as do most of California's 44 CoCs.

When was the count conducted? _____

The **sheltered count** included residents of emergency shelters and transitional housing programs throughout the county who slept in these facilities during the night of **January 21 through the early morning of January 22, 2026**.

The **unsheltered count** was conducted on **Thursday, January 22, 2026**, beginning at **6:00 a.m.**

HUD allows counting in hard-to-reach or remote areas to continue for up to **seven days** after the count, provided that individuals:

1. Are asked if they were homeless on the day of the count, and
2. Are assigned a unique identifier to prevent duplication.

A limited amount of supplemental counting occurred during the seven-day period following the count to ensure full coverage of remote areas.

Who was counted? _____

Per HUD instructions, a person was considered homeless—and therefore counted—only if they met HUD's definition of homelessness by residing in:

- A place not meant for human habitation, such as a car, park, sidewalk, or abandoned building;
- An emergency shelter
- Transitional housing for homeless persons.

Each person counted was also asked a series of survey questions to ensure the collection of all HUD-required subpopulation data, including information related to:

- Adults with HIV/AIDS
- Serious mental illness
- Substance use disorders

Additional subpopulations counted included:

- Families
- Chronically homeless families and individuals
- Veterans
- Youth ages 18 – 24.

Reporting on the number of sheltered and unsheltered adult survivors of domestic violence is optional under HUD guidance.

Locally desired survey questions were also included, such as:

- Did you become homeless for the first time during the past 12 months?
- Has a doctor or other medical professional ever told you that you have a chronic health condition that is life-threatening such as heart, lung, liver, kidney or cancerous disease?
- Have you been incarcerated during the last 12 months?

-
- Have you ever been in foster care?
 - How much is your monthly income?
 - In what city/community did you first become homeless?
 - In which state were you born?
 - Where did you sleep last night?

Who was not counted?

Per HUD instructions, a person was **not** considered homeless if they resided in:

- Medical facilities (e.g., hospitals, psychiatric facilities, nursing homes)
- Jails, prisons, or juvenile detention facilities
- Chemical dependency facilities (e.g., detox facilities or inpatient treatment)
- Foster care homes or group homes

Additionally:

- Children identified as homeless under **McKinney-Vento** definitions by schools were **not** included unless they were staying in emergency shelter, transitional housing, or were unsheltered.
- Persons who were “**doubled up**” (temporarily staying with others) or “**near homelessness**” were not included, as HUD categorizes them as **at risk**, not homeless.

Like many counties, San Bernardino has a substantial number of households that are at **risk of homelessness**. According to the U.S. Census Bureau’s 2024 Small Area Income and Poverty Estimates (SAIPE):

- **13.2% of households** (approximately **86,000 households** representing **about 274,000 residents**) were living at or below the poverty level.

Factors contributing to homelessness include:

- Rising housing costs
- Job loss
- Increasing healthcare expenses
- Domestic violence
- Mental illness
- Physical disabilities
- Substance abuse

Who carried out the count?

The homeless count and survey were a coordinated effort involving:

- **San Bernardino County Homeless Partnership (SBCHP)**
- **San Bernardino County Office of Homeless Services (OHS)**
- **Institute for Urban Initiatives**

Approximately **574 community volunteers** served as counters. Additionally:

- **23 cities and towns** provided staff support and space for training and deployment
- **Law enforcement agencies** contributed expertise regarding known homeless locations
- **Nonprofit agencies, faith-based organizations, County departments**, and other partners assisted in planning and logistics
- The **San Bernardino County Innovation and Technology Department (ITD)** developed maps used by field teams

San Bernardino County Homeless Partnership (SBCHP)

The San Bernardino County Homeless Partnership (SBCHP) was formed to strengthen and coordinate countywide efforts to address homelessness. Its mission includes:

- Developing a public-private partnership network
- Improving coordination of services and resources
- Leading countywide planning to prevent and reduce homelessness
- Facilitating communication, cooperation, and collaboration among service providers

SBCHP members include community organizations, faith-based institutions, schools, nonprofits, private industry, and government agencies at all levels.

Office of Homeless Services (OHS)

The Office of Homeless Services (OHS) serves as the central clearinghouse for homelessness issues across County departments. It provides administrative support to SBCHP and ensures that the Partnership's vision, mission, and goals are implemented.

Institute for Urban Initiatives

The Institute for Urban Initiatives is comprised of multiple community and faith-based entities that address economic, housing, and social needs locally and regionally. It has completed more than 100 assessments across Southern California, focusing on:

- Affordable housing
- Micro-business support
- Fair housing
- Homelessness
- Migrant farming
- Street vending





Unsheltered Count and Survey

To conduct the unsheltered count, Esri's ArcGIS software platform was used. The 2026 Homeless PITC utilized a configuration of **Survey 123 for ArcGIS and Operations Dashboard for ArcGIS**, implemented by the Office of Homeless Services (OHS) in partnership with the Innovation and Technology Department (ITD).

The Homeless PITC incorporated the following tools:

- **Homeless Count Survey**, consisting of approximately 30 interrelated questions to meet HUD requirements for collecting subpopulation data and fulfilling local data needs.
- **Homeless Count Dashboard**, used to monitor count activity and survey submissions in real time.
- **Homeless Count Results Application**, provided instant viewing of data and tables that detailed real-time results.

A digital survey form was designed to streamline the surveyor's experience by displaying only relevant questions based on the respondent's answers. This reduced decision-making for surveyors and improved efficiency.

Automated logic was integrated into the form to perform real-time calculations. For example:

- Responses were combined to instantly determine whether a person met HUD's definition of **chronically homeless**
- Extensive testing ensured all conditional pathways produced accurate results.

These automated calculations enabled real-time monitoring of key metrics and eliminated the need for manual post-survey computations.

Digital surveys also enabled precise location capture. When a survey was completed, the GPS coordinates of the surveyor's mobile device were recorded, identifying where the encounter occurred. This supported mapping and geospatial analysis. For safety and privacy reasons, **location data was not collected for sheltered surveys.**

At the conclusion of the count, all data underwent quality checks, including:

- Removal of invalid records (e.g., practice surveys before the official count)
- Identification and elimination of duplicate surveys based on unique identifiers and location patterns

Closer Monitoring of Undercounted Areas

Esri Survey 123's real-time dashboard provided immediate visibility into where surveys were being submitted. Each data point on the dashboard represented a household counted.

During the count, if data points did not appear in locations known to have homeless persons, volunteers were dispatched to those areas to ensure full coverage.

After the count, if gaps remained in known locations, professional outreach workers were deployed the next day. Individuals encountered were included in the total count if they had not been counted previously, consistent with HUD allowances for next-day counting.

HUD permits next-day counting under two conditions:

- Individuals must be asked whether they were homeless **on the night of the count**; and
- A **unique identifier** must be created to avoid duplication.

A unique identifier was created for every person counted on the main count day and the following day. If a unique identifier appeared more than once, it was assumed to refer to the same person. A person was included in the final count only if they confirmed "yes" when asked "if they were homeless on the day of the count," which was on Thursday, January 22.

Analyzing the subpopulation data

Only adults and unaccompanied teenage children counted as unsheltered were surveyed. **Accompanied children within families were not surveyed.**

Of the **2,433 unsheltered adults**,

- **1,276 (52.5%)** were surveyed, and
- **1,157 (47.5%)** were observed but not interviewed.

Surveyors were instructed to mark “**No**” for survey question 5 (“Are you able to interview this person?”) and provide their best estimate for questions 5a–8 (sex, age, race/ethnicity) when:

- There were safety concerns
- The individual was sleeping
- The individual refused to be interviewed

Sheltered Homeless Count

HUD encourages the use of **Homeless Management Information Services (HMIS)** data to generate sheltered counts and subpopulation data for programs where 100% of beds were participating in HMIS. For these programs, HMIS data provided the number of:

- Occupied beds
- Persons in each HUD-required subpopulation

A supplemental data collection instrument was used to collect the same information for:

- Programs not participating in HMIS
- Participating agencies with incomplete or inaccurate HMIS data

Both HMIS data and the supplemental instrument used identical subpopulation questions to ensure consistency across programs.

Unsheltered Homelessness

Of the **3,718 persons** counted as homeless in 2026, 2,448 (65.8%) -were unsheltered. HUD defines an unsheltered individual or family as:

“An individual or family who lacks a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence, meaning: (i) An individual or family with a primary nighttime residence that is a public or private place not designed for or ordinarily used as a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings.”

Of the **2,448 unsheltered persons, 2,433 were adults and 15 were children**. Of the 2,433 unsheltered adults, **1,276 agreed to be surveyed**, while **1,157 were counted through observation only**.

As previously noted, surveyors were instructed to mark “**No**” for Question 5, (“Are you able to interview this person?”) and to provide their best estimate for Questions 5a – 8 (sex, age, race/ethnicity) when:

- Safety concerns existed
- The person was sleeping
- The person refused to be interviewed

Accompanied children were not surveyed directly. Their demographic information was provided by the accompanying adult. No **unaccompanied children under 18** were encountered unsheltered.

HUD requires that sex, race/ethnicity, and age be reported for all unsheltered adults and children- whether surveyed or observed. Continuums of Care (CoCs) cannot submit the PITC data in HUD’s Homeless Data Exchange (HDX) 2.0 system until these data elements are completed for all 2,448 individuals.

As stated earlier, of the **2,433 unsheltered adults**,

- **1,276 (52.5%)** were surveyed
- **1,157 (47.5%)** were observed.

To meet HUD’s reporting requirements, **basic extrapolation** was used to assign sex, race/ethnicity, and age categories to observed adults. The proportion of surveyed adults in each category was applied to the number of observed adults.

What is Your Sex?

An example is shown in **Table 7** below. Table 7 provides a breakdown by sex for:

- Unsheltered adults
- Unaccompanied youth under age 18
- Accompanied children under age 18 in families

HUD requires reporting for the following categories:

Female, Male, Client Doesn't Know, Client Prefers Not to Answer.

Key findings:

- Nearly **three-fourths (71.3%)** of adults were male.
- More than **one-fourth (28.5%)** of adults were female.
- Among accompanied children, **60.0% were female** and **40.0% were male.**

Extrapolation example:

28.5% of the **1,276 surveyed adults** identified as female.

Applying this proportion to the **1,157 observed adults** results in **693 total females.**

(Extrapolation was not used for accompanied children.)

What is Your Race/Ethnicity?

Table 8 provides race/ethnicity data for adults, unaccompanied youth, and accompanied children.

Key findings:

- **37.8%** of adults identified as **Hispanic/Latina/e/o.**
- **34.3%** identified as **White.**
- **18.8%** identified as **Black/ African American or African.**
- Among accompanied children, **80.0%** were Hispanic/Latina/e/o.

How Old Are You?

Table 9 shows age distribution for unsheltered adults according to HUD's required age categories.

Key findings:

- **50.8%** of adults were age **44 or younger**:
 - 2.7% age 18–24
 - 19.0% age 25–34
 - 29.1% age 35–44
- **49.2%** were age **45 or older**:
 - 23.1% age 45–54
 - 18.9% age 55–64
 - 7.2% age 65+

Other Subpopulations

Table 10 provides a breakdown of additional subpopulations among unsheltered adults.

Basic extrapolation was applied to each subpopulation in the table.

For example, **40.7%** of the **1,276 surveyed unsheltered adults** met HUD's definition of chronic homelessness. Applying the same percentage (40.7%) to the **1,157 observed adults** results in **471 chronically homeless observed adults**. Adding the **519 surveyed adults** who were chronically homeless yields a total of **990 chronically homeless adults**.

*Several questions were asked to determine whether an adult met HUD’s definition of chronic homelessness, defined as an individual with a disability as defined in Section 401(9) of the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 11360(9)) who lives in a place not meant for human habitation, a safe haven, or in an emergency shelter and has been homeless and living as described for at least 12 months, or on at least four separate occasions in the last three years, as long as the combined occasions equal at least 12 months.

**Families: The 8 families consisted of 11 adults and 15 children. Two families were chronically homeless, including two adults and five children.

***Veterans: 56.6% (106 of 187) of the veterans counted were chronically homeless.

Other Survey Questions

Other questions were included in the survey that were not required by HUD. A total of **1,276 unsheltered adults** responded to these questions in the table below.

For example, **462 respondents (36.2%)** answered “Yes” to the question “Did you become homeless for the first time during the past 12 months?” as shown below.

Sheltered Homelessness

Of the **3,718 persons** counted in 2026, **1,270 persons (34.2%)** were sheltered. Among them:

- **930 persons** were counted in shelters or received non-congregate shelter through motel vouchers, and
- **340 persons** were counted in transitional housing programs.

HUD requires that all persons living in shelters, transitional housing programs, and safe haven programs on the night of the count be included in the sheltered count.

As required by HUD, the sheltered count included all persons and households sleeping in emergency shelters (including seasonal shelters) and transitional housing programs listed on the **Housing Inventory Chart (HIC)**.

Persons staying in hotels or motels paid for by social service agencies were included if the voucher program was listed on the HIC.

HUD additionally requires that the total number of sheltered persons be reported by **pre-designated subpopulations**. The 2026 subpopulation data are presented in the tables below.

Prior to the count, OHS staff and members of the **Key Person Task Force** updated the HIC to add new programs and remove inactive programs.

Because HUD encourages using Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) data for sheltered counts when programs have 100% HMIS bed coverage, HMIS data was used whenever possible to gather:

- Total number of occupied beds
- Number of persons in each HUD-required subpopulation

For programs not participating in HMIS, or for HMIS programs with incomplete or inaccurate data, a **supplemental data collection instrument**-identical to the HMIS subpopulation questions was used. As a result, sheltered count data for all programs were collected through either HMIS or the supplemental instrument.

Table 13 provides a breakdown by age of the sheltered population (**1,270 adults and children**) according to HUD requirements.

Key Findings

1. The number of adults and children counted as homeless **decreased by 3.1%**, from **3,837 in 2025** to **3,718 in 2026**.
2. The number of adults and children counted as **unsheltered decreased by 7.1%**, from **2,636 in 2025** to **2,448 in 2026**.
3. The number of adults and children counted as **sheltered increased to 1,270 in 2026**, which is **69 more persons**, representing a **5.7% increase** compared to **1,201 persons in 2025**.
4. **More than three-fourths (79.5%), or 2,955 of the 3,718** homeless adults and children were counted in eight jurisdictions: Barstow, Colton, Fontana, Ontario, Rancho Cucamonga, Redlands, San Bernardino, and Victorville.
 - a. These eight cities accounted for **1,911 unsheltered individuals (78.1%)** of the total unsheltered population of 2,448 and **1,124 (88.5%)** of the 1,270 persons counted in shelters and transitional housing.
5. **More than one-third (36.2%)** of unsheltered adults became homeless for the first time within the **12 months preceding the count**.
6. **Approximately one-third (29.8%)** of unsheltered adults stated that **San Bernardino** was the city where they first became homeless.
7. **Close to half (40.7%)** of unsheltered adults were **chronically homeless**, meaning they had been homeless for **one year or longer** and had a **disabling condition** (e.g., mental illness, chronic health condition, physical disability).
8. **More than one-fourth (28.6%)** of unsheltered adults reported “Yes” when asked if they had been **incarcerated during the past 12 months**.
9. Nearly **two-thirds (64.0%)** of unsheltered adults reported “**No Income**” when asked to state their monthly income.
10. **More than three-fourths (82.4%)** of unsheltered adults reported either “**No Monthly Income**” (64.0%), “**\$1 - \$250**” (10.9%), or “**\$251 - \$500**” (7.5%) when asked to state their monthly income.
