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1. SUBJECT: APPROVE THE RECOGNIZED OBLIGATION PAYMENT SCHEDULE FOR JULY 2020 - JUNE 2021 AND ADMINISTRATIVE BUDGET (DISTRICTS: ALL)

OVERVIEW

On January 24, 2012 (14), the County of San Diego was designated as the Successor Agency to the Redevelopment Agency of the County of San Diego (Successor Agency) to oversee the wind-down of the former redevelopment agency's operations following the steps established by ABX1 26 and AB 1484, collectively known as the Dissolution Act. These steps include preserving assets, fulfilling legally binding commitments, overseeing the termination of activities, and returning resources expeditiously to the affected taxing entities. The San Diego County Board of Supervisors serves as the local Successor Agency Board of Directors.

The Recognized Obligation Payment Schedule (ROPS) is the report that authorizes the amount of former redevelopment agency property tax increment to be allocated to the Successor Agency for payment of Enforceable Obligations. The Successor Agency is required to submit the ROPS and the administrative budget annually to the County Oversight Board.

Today's action requests Successor Agency Board of Directors' approval of the ROPS for July 2020 - June 2021 (ROPS 20-21) and the related administrative budget for the same period is requested. Total enforceable obligations of \$2,350,600 are eligible to be funded, including an administrative budget of \$30,000. If approved, both items will be presented to the Countywide Oversight Board on January 16, 2020.

RECOMMENDATION(S) CHIEF ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER

- 1. Approve the Recognized Obligation Payment Schedule (ROPS) for July 2020 June 2021 and authorize staff to make any non-substantive changes to the ROPS to comply with the Department of Finance's requirements for submittal.
- 2. Approve the administrative budget for July 2020 June 2021.

FISCAL IMPACT

The payments shown on the Recognized Obligation Payment Schedule for July 2020 - June 2021 will be included in the Fiscal Year 2020-21 Operational Plan for the Successor Agency. The funding source is property tax increment distributed from the Redevelopment Property Tax Trust Fund.
