








Justice At Last Client Demographic



- Average age of a JAL client is mid 20's to early 30's
- Prior to 2018, majority of clients were female victims of sex trafficking
- Current: 26% Male 74% Female
- Recent increase in identification of labor trafficking and male clients.

Justice At Last Client Legal Needs

Top Legal Areas:

- Crime Victims' Rights (33%)
- Post-Conviction Vacatur (16%)
- Family Law(11%)
- Immigration Relief (8%).
- Since its inception, JAL has offered CVR representation to 100% of its clients
- In 2019, 100 survivors successfully participated in the criminal legal system to hold the trafficker accountable

Justice At Last Legal Needs Summary

- Most of our clients require legal representation in two or more complex legal areas simultaneously
- Many clients do not self-identify their legal needs or are aware of the legal rights that exist to protect them
- Common for both foreign-national and domestic survivors to not be familiar with various legal systems including the criminal legal system

Impact of COVID-19

- Temporarily suspended all in-person client meetings and staff are working remotely except for as needed client accompaniment to report crimes to law enforcement and triage of cases;
- Regular e-appearances and in-person appearances in court;
- Developed a resource guide that answers common legal questions;
- Dealing with an influx of calls for new legal needs because many of our clients are facing new basic needs challenges and require additional legal services to access unemployment benefits, disability insurance, renter protections, wage theft and victim compensation;

Impact of COVID-19

- Working closely with our clients on the phone to continue providing holistic wrap-around services;
- Received a surge in requests for emergency basic needs support, from assistance with rent payments, food and gas gift cards, and recently paid a client's utility bills;
- Already exceeded of our client incidentals' budget to meet our clients' emergencies requests for assistance.
- Collaborated and forged new partnerships with CBOs and Foundations to provide PPE and emergency support for our clients
