

SUPPORTED TRAINING & **EMPLOYMENT PROGRAM** (STEP)

What is the STEP Program?

The County of San Mateo STEP program is an internship program, managed collectively by the Human Resources Department and Human Services Agency (HSA), and designed to prepare and train current or former foster youth ages 18-27, transition into the workforce. The purpose of the program is to introduce these young adults who are at risk of underemployment to "the world of professional work."

Additional Program Benefits

On-the-Job and County Training

Interns receive specific job training from their coach and have access to all county and consortium courses.

Monthly STEP Intern Meetings

Interns come together every month for a "refresh" meeting with their peers. In addition to team building, interns receive program updates and hear from guest speakers.

Peer Coaching

Each intern checks-in regularly with the designated STEP Coordinator, a former foster youth who supports the youth through their personal challenges.

What Type of Work Do STEP **Interns Perform?**

We are committed to providing our STEP Interns with the tools, support, and resources they need to succeed in their internship. STEP Interns can:

- Perform general office duties and errands
- Provide excellent customer service
- Create flyers and marketing materials
- Manage filing systems
- Collaborate on special projects
- Update paperwork and maintain documents
- Help organize and maintain office common areas
- Create, maintain, and enter information into various databases


