



## UPDATE FROM MAYOR DEBRA JONES

### January 2022

I'm happy to report that the City of Victorville completed its transition to district-based elections last month, and we're grateful to everyone in our community who participated in this very important endeavor.

In a district-based election, the City is divided into five separate districts, each with one City Council Member who resides in the district and is chosen by only the voters in that district.

After collecting community input at three community meetings and six public hearings, our City Council adopted Ordinance 2422 on Dec. 22. This ordinance includes the final district election map and sequencing.

Our current City Council Members will remain at-large representatives for the entire City of Victorville until we host our first district-based election in November 2022 when the Council Member seats for districts 2 and 4 will be on the ballot.

Following the November 2022 election, the remaining three Council Members will continue as at-large representatives until the election for districts 1, 3, and 5 in November 2024.
