



STATEMENT OF INSUFFICIENCY

April 25, 2016

On March 31, 2016, Republican U.S. Senate candidate Jon Keyser submitted 16,067 petition signatures to the Secretary of State. The candidate seeks nomination by petition to the June 28, 2016 primary election ballot. Under Colorado law, Mr. Keyser's petition must contain at least 1,500 valid signatures from each of Colorado's seven congressional districts, for a total of at least 10,500 valid signatures statewide.¹

¹ Under section 1-4-801(2)(c)(II), C.R.S., a major party statewide candidate petition requires signatures from "at least one thousand five hundred eligible electors in each congressional district"

The Secretary of State has determined that Mr. Keyser submitted an insufficient number of valid signatures to qualify for placement on the 2016 primary election ballot. A record of all accepted and rejected signatures, including reasons for each rejection, is on file with the Secretary of State.
