



**STATEMENT OF INSUFFICIENCY**

April 24, 2018

On March 20, 2018, Democratic attorney general candidate Brad Levin submitted 15,996 petition signatures to the Secretary of State. The candidate seeks nomination by petition to the June 26, 2018, Democratic primary election ballot. Under Colorado law, Mr. Levin's petition must contain at least 1,500 valid signatures from each of Colorado's seven congressional districts, for a total of at least 10,500 valid signatures statewide.<sup>1</sup>

<sup>1</sup> Under section 1-4-801(2)(c)(II), C.R.S., a major party attorney general candidate petition requires signatures from "at least one thousand five hundred eligible electors in each congressional district . . . ."

The Secretary of State has determined that Mr. Levin submitted an insufficient number of valid signatures to qualify for placement on the 2018 primary election ballot. A record of all accepted and rejected signatures, including reasons for each rejection, is on file with the Secretary of State.
