- **2. Coyotes aren't just howling**. This season, coyotes are busy marking territory for breeding. To them, an off-leash dog might seem like a rival, which could lead to dangerous confrontations.
- **3. Small critters have a big impact**: Small creatures like rabbits and voles are tiny but essential to our ecosystem. Off-leash dogs can disrupt this balance by hunting or scaring away this important wildlife.
- **4. Dog poop isn't just gross—it's harmful**: Dog poop doesn't break down quickly and can grow harmful bacteria that can seep into water systems. Off-leash dogs are more likely to "go" where owners don't notice, leaving behind more than just paw prints
- **5. Off-leash dogs can cause anxiety**: Some people and pets feel uneasy around off-leash dogs, no matter how friendly they are. Keeping your dog leashed is a courteous way to ensure everyone feels safe and comfortable on our pathways and trails.
