Boulder County Hazardous Materials Management Facility (HMMF)

- Batteries (car, household, & rechargeable)
- Car care products
- Cleaning products
- Fuels (diesel, gasoline, & kerosene)
- Fluorescent bulbs (straight tubes & CFLs)
- Gas powered motors
- Nicotine vaporizers (disposable devices, batteries, cartridges, e-liquid. No THC.)
- Paint (oil-based, latex, & aerosols)
- Paint thinners & strippers
- PCB ballasts
- Pesticides, insecticides, & fungicides
- Pool/spa chemicals
- Propane cylinders, 1-lb (Coleman-size)
- Thermometers & mercury containing devices

- Ammunition, explosives, fireworks, & flares
- Asbestos-containing insulation, tile, & linoleum
- BBQ propane tanks larger than 1-lb, compressed gas cylinders
- Business waste - small quantities accepted by appointment only at HMMF (see website for details)
- Drums larger than 5 gallons
- Expired meds
- Medical waste
- Non-hazardous wastes
- Radioactive materials
- Sharps

Eco-Cycle Center for Hard to Recycle Materials (CHaRM)

- Bike tires & tubes
- Books & manuals
- Computers, laptops, cell phones, & tablets
- Gas-powered mowers
- Plastic bags, bubble wrap, & thin foam packing sheets
- Small scrap metal (4' length/width maximum)

Items for a fee (Town will cover 50%)

- CDs & DVDs (\$3.00/lb)
- CRT TVs and monitors (\$0.69/lb)
- Fire extinguishers (\$8.00/unit)
- Flatscreen TVs, audio equipment, small appliances, & monitors (\$0.59/lb)
- Miscellaneous electronics not included in free items above (\$0.59/lb)

- Appliances containing freon
- Bicycles
- Big durable #2 plastics (play structures, lawn furniture, etc.)
- Cooking oil
- Mattresses
- Plate glass windows
- Shredded paper or service to shred paper
- Single-stream recycling
- White block foam packaging #6, rigid styrofoam
