INVESTIGATIVE NARRATIVE

Summary of Complaint

On October 10, 2025, at approximately 1549 hours, the Internal Affairs Unit received a complaint via electronic mail message (email) from an individual identified only as Gunny234 against Sergeant Lacey Santone. In the email, Gunny234 stated, "*After DC [Deputy Chief] Munoz was let go, Sgt. Santone unprofessionally and possibly illegally under [Florida State Statute] 815.06 accessed the building video system in order to show him walking out of the building to the employees she supervises.*" The email further stated Sergeant Santone was laughing and mocking former Deputy Chief Wilson Munoz.

On October 13, 2025, due to the allegations involving a potential criminal component, the Osceola County State Attorney's Office Bureau Chief Crystal Allen was contacted to determine whether a criminal investigation should be initiated. Ms. Allen indicated a victim or witness who was present when the video was accessed would need to be identified for the case to be considered for criminal prosecution.

Internal Affairs Manager Carlos Espinosa responded to Gunny234's email and inquired whether the individual would provide a sworn written statement or identify anyone who was present when the video was allegedly shown in order to determine how to proceed with the investigation. Mr. Espinosa stated if the agency did not receive a response from Gunny234 within seven (7) days, the Kissimmee Police Department (KPD) would assume they were no longer interested in participating with any investigation and the matter would be investigated administratively.

Note: As of October 28, 2025, we have not received any response from Gunny234 either by email or telephone, regarding the complaint against Sergeant Santone.

On October 21, 2025, at approximately 1000 hours, I contacted Ms. Allen, via cellular telephone. After providing her an updated briefing, specifically that no witness or victim had been identified and the anonymous complainant was not cooperating, Ms. Allen declined pursuing criminal charges and agreed an administrative investigation would be appropriate concerning the allegations against Sergeant Santone. Chief of Police Charles L. Broadway authorized an Internal Affairs Investigation (25-051) into the allegation.

On October 21, 2025 at approximately 1252 hours, Sergeant Santone was notified of the pending investigation via department email via her chain of command. Sergeant Santone was advised not to discuss the investigation with any individual except for those privileged communications guaranteed by Florida State Statute.

Investigative Timeline

October 21, 2025

Sergeant Santone submitted an interoffice memorandum to Chief Broadway, requesting participation in the KPD Short Form Discipline Resolution process, which was approved.

October 24, 2025

The Internal Affairs Unit received the KPD Short Form Discipline Resolution Agreement form signed by Sergeant Santone and Assistant Chief of Police Kevin McGinley.

Conclusion/Findings

This investigation was conducted to determine whether Sergeant Lacey Santone violated Kissimmee Police Department General Orders or State Statutes by accessing building security video for unauthorized reasons. According to the Osceola County State Attorney's Office Bureau Chief Crystal Allen, no state statute was violated. Therefore, this case was resolved through the Short Form Discipline Resolution process, resulting in a finding of **SUSTAINED** for Sergeant Santone violating Kissimmee Police Department General Order 201.03(t) *General Conduct on Duty; Unauthorized Use of City Equipment*.




