




Meteorology Summary

Statewide Overview, Next 24 Hours:

A high pressure system is nearly overhead in Florida, with today being the last totally dry day before the next storm system begins to approach the region tomorrow afternoon. The next storm system will bring locally heavy rainfall with some threat for severe weather in the Peninsula.

Skies are mostly sunny today statewide. Some high clouds will move in at times. High temperatures will be seasonable- in the middle 60s to lower 70s. There is no chance of rain today or tonight statewide. Winds will be 5 mph or less today.

Clear skies will continue tonight with low temperatures above freezing. A few sheltered locations in interior sections of the Big Bend may drop into the middle 30s and see some frost. Patchy fog can't be ruled out either in the western Panhandle or Central Florida.






Coastal Hazards / Hydrology

Rip Currents: Light winds today will result in a minimal rip current risk at most beaches today. A **moderate** risk is expected from Walton to Franklin County in the Panhandle, however. Remember, always swim within sight of a lifeguard. Rip currents can still occur on low risk days!

Lake Okeechobee average elevation is 12.75 feet, which is 1.96 feet <u>below</u> normal for this time of year.

Hydrology: Minor to moderate river and creek flooding is expected to continue across much of North Florida during the next several days. 22 River Flood Warnings are in effect, with a current list found here. **Moderate flooding** is ongoing for Suwannee River at White Springs and the Alapaha River near Jennings. **Major flooding** is occurring at the upper Suwannee River near Benton and is forecast for later this week near Suwannee Springs. Moderate to major flooding is also forecast to occur within the next few days along the lower Santa Fe River. 




Drought & Fire Weather

Fire Weather: A low wildfire threat is expected in South Florida today where drought continues. Winds will be 5 mph or less today and relative humidity above critical levels. <u>County burn bans</u> are in effect for 6 counties, including Gulf County in the Panhandle and 5 in the Peninsula that are prohibited year-round.

<u>The Keetch-Byram Drought Index</u> average for Florida is 203 (+3) on a scale from 0 (very moist) to 800 (very dry). There are currently <u>7</u> Florida counties with a KBDI above 500, all in the Peninsula.




