




Meteorology Summary

Statewide Overview, Next 24 Hours:

A slow-moving cold front over Central Florida will slowly move southward through the remainder of the Peninsula today and be offshore by tonight. Along and behind the cold front, scattered showers are expected, mainly from the Big Bend and Northeast Florida into the Peninsula. Showers should taper across North Florida this morning and continue across the Peninsula into the evening. Thunderstorms are not expected with the front.

Temperatures will be cooler in the wake of the front with highs in the upper 50s to middle 60s across North Florida and upper 60s to middle 70s in Central Florida. However, with the front not clearing South Florida until tonight, highs in South Florida will still reach the lower to middle 80s.

Overnight lows will be quite chilly in North Florida, especially compared to recent nights. Lows will fall into the middle 30s to middle 40s for much of North Florida. Some patchy frost will be possible, especially where winds become nearly calm. In Central Florida, lows will be in the 50s with 60s to near 70 in South Florida. Fog is not expected tonight.





Coastal Hazards & Hydrology


Rip Currents: North to northwest winds at 10 mph and 2-3' waves will result in a moderate rip current risk for Panhandle beaches from Walton through Franklin County. Winds will shift out of the north and waves will build along the East Coast, resulting in a moderate rip current risk from Nassau to Martin Counties. Elsewhere, there is a low rip current risk. For the latest Rip Current Outlook, visit www.weather.gov/beach.

Marine Hazards: Red Tide has not been observed above background levels.

Coastal Flooding: Coastal flooding is not expected.

Lake Okeechobee average elevation is 12.94 feet as of Tuesday, which is 1.65 feet <u>below</u> normal for this time of year. Little change in lake level is expected over the next couple of days.

Hydrology: A **River Flood Warning** remains in effect for the Apalachicola River near Blountstown until further notice. Minor flooding is expected to continue into next week. For more information on specific rivers, please visit the Southeast River Forecast Center here. Rainfall totals will be light across the state (<0.50") with localized totals near 1" possible, mainly in South Florida.






Drought & Fire Weather


Fire Weather: Humidity will be moderate to high today (40-70%) with winds becoming north to northwest at 10 mph for most of the state. Recent rainfall has increased soil moisture but some areas are still in drought conditions and have pockets of dry fuels. This will result in a **low to locally moderate wildfire threat** statewide.

There are currently 20 <u>active wildfires</u> across the state burning a total of 186.6 acres. All fires over 10 acres are 100% contained. A <u>County Burn Ban</u> is in effect for Duval, Orange, Hillsborough, Pinellas, and Sarasota (prohibited year-round).

<u>The Keetch-Byram Drought Index</u> average for Florida is 261 **(+8)** on a scale from 0 (very moist) to 800 (very dry). There are **0** Florida counties with an average KBDI at or above 500.


