

Meteorology Summary

Statewide Overview, Next 24 Hours:

North Florida:


Low clouds, fog, and drizzle will dissipate by mid-day. Some breaks in the clouds this afternoon will allow temperatures to reach the lower 70s. Isolated showers will develop, particularly in the Big Bend. Winds will be light and variable. Tonight, dense fog and drizzle will once again develop across the region with the lowest visibilities expected in Northeast Florida. A weak cold front will approach the Panhandle overnight increasing rain chances. Scattered showers and an isolated thunderstorms are expected. There is no threat of severe weather today or tonight. Low temperatures will be near 60 degrees.

Central Florida:

Patchy dense fog will dissipate by mid-day with mostly sunny to partly clouds skies this afternoon. High temperatures will be in the lower 80s with light winds. Isolated showers will develop this afternoon, particularly along the I-95 corridor. Any rain showers will dissipate after sunset. Another round of low clouds and patchy dense fog will develop overnight. Low temperatures will be in the 60s.

South Florida:

Sunny skies this morning will turn partly cloudy this afternoon. A stray shower is possible with the heating of the day. High temperatures will be in the low to mid-80s. East winds will be at 5-10 mph. Light, patchy fog may develop overnight- particularly across inland Southwest Florida. Low temperatures tonight will range from the upper 60s to the middle 70s.





Coastal Hazards & Hydrology


Rip Currents: Breezy onshore winds will result in a **high rip current risk** for Southeast Florida beaches today. With lighter winds in the Panhandle and across the rest of the East Coast, a **moderate rip current risk** is expected from Martin to Nassau and for Franklin County. There is a **low risk** today for the West Coast and the rest of the Panhandle. Wave heights will be 1-3' statewide. For the latest Rip Current Outlook, visit <u>www.weather.gov/beach</u>.

Marine Hazards: <u>Red Tide</u> has not been observed above background levels.

Coastal Flooding: Coastal flooding is not expected.

Lake Okeechobee average elevation is 12.93 feet as of Friday, which is an estimated 1.67 feet <u>below</u> normal for this time of year. Little change in lake level is expected this week.

Hydrology: A **River Flood Warning** remains in effect for the Apalachicola River near Blountstown until further notice. Minor flooding is expected to continue this week. Several rivers in the Panhandle will crest in action stage over the next couple of days due to rainfall this past weekend. For more information on specific rivers, please visit the Southeast River Forecast Center <u>here</u>. Rainfall totals today will generally be less than 0.25". Additional river flooding is not forecast.






Drought & Fire Weather

Fire Weather: Humidity will be high today with light winds. However, some areas are still in drought conditions and have pockets of dry fuels. This will result in a **low to locally moderate wildfire threat** statewide.

There are currently 11 <u>active wildfires</u> across the state burning a total of 173.5 acres. A <u>County Burn Ban</u> is in effect for Duval, Orange, Hillsborough, Pinellas, and Sarasota (prohibited year-round).

<u>The Keetch-Byram Drought Index</u> average for Florida is 260 (+3) on a scale from 0 (very moist) to 800 (very dry). There are <u>0</u> Florida counties with an average KBDI at or above 500.






Space Weather

Space Weather: The sun is spotless and there is no threat of a significant solar flare. Solar winds are expected to remain light, and geomagnetic storming is not expected. The space weather threat to Florida remains very low.
